gales and a heavy sea
at 5 P.M. more ship
the S. S. and set the jib
and hoist out the main
top sail

Midst part light air
at day light hoist out
sail from ship to the
S. S.

W. S. W. Latter part the same at
10 P.M. raised a large sperm
whale going quick to windward
towards and chased 10 miles until
not patch him so ended this day
cloudy weather

W. Commenced with light air
boats of at 3 P.M. came on board
at 5 P.M. more ship to the
S. S. at 4 P.M. hoist out the
top sail light air

had times and a heavy
sea from to keep a bundle

at 4 P.M. light air steering to

at 11 P.M. saw a single whale going
quick to windward beyond could not
get fast so ended this day

W. Commenced with pleasant breeze
and fine weather steering to
the S. S. the watch employed
in ship duty at 4 P.M. hoist
to the pump to the W. S. W.

all sail heaving to the W. S. W.
