

Ship Courier of Dorchester cruising in the
 Wind N.W. Remarks on board Wed. Jan. 13th
 Commenced with pleasant
 breeze and fine weather
 at 1 PM hauled ship to
 the S. and at 4 PM both in
 sail heading S.E.W.

Middle part moderate
 at day light made all sail

N.W. Latter part fine weather
 heading to the S.E.W. at 8 AM
 saw a whale breaved and fed
 and got down and fed again
 and killed and got both hauled
 to the ship and commenced cutting
 at 11th finished saw two whales
 but could not get past or could
 this day

Lat by Obs 40 35

Wind N.W. Remarks on board Thurs. Jan. 14th
 Commenced with fine weather
 two sail in night on boiling
 and one cutting saw several
 whales and got past
 at 4 PM both in sail and
 commenced boiling heading W.S.W.

Middle part the same
 at day light made sail
 and were ship foggy

Latter part moderate and foggy
 at 9 AM hauled ship. Day of
 Lynn with 12 whales and 12
 got another saw plenty of whales
 breaved and fed and hauled
 to end the day

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South Atlantic Ocean Wind N.W. Remarks on board Friday Jan. 15th 1838
 Commenced with fine weather
 at 5 PM saw 3 whales breaved
 got past to two at 6 PM killed them
 5 miles to windward light sail
 commenced boiling at 11 got them to the
 ship and both in sail

Middle part calm employed
 in boiling

Latter part the same at 6 AM
 commenced cutting at 12 finished
 made sail and commenced boiling
 to end the day ship day in
 night boiling

Lat by Obs 40 57 XX

Wind N.W. Remarks on board Saturday Jan. 16th
 Commenced with moderate
 breeze and fine weather heading
 W.S.W. all hands employed in
 boiling and clearing the decks

N. Middle part pleasant breeze
 heading W.S.W. the sails out
 at day light strong breeze both
 in sail ship day in night boiling

N.N.W. Latter part fresh and again
 heading to the W. all hands
 employed in boiling and storing
 took up the ship from Bristol
 with 14 or 15 to end the day
 one ship in sight
