

Ship Courier from New Bedford towards the Western Isles.

Friday June 22th 1838

Commences with fresh gales from the South with thick rainy weather steering E. S. E. under short sail middle part thick equally weather wind nearly all round the compass took in the Fore Mizzen Top Sail & Fore Lark latter part strong breezes from S. S. W. with fair weather steering E. S. E. with 2 reefs in the Top Sail employed stowing spars & lashing them so ends. Lat by Obs. 39° 19' Long by Obs. 25° 45' West.

Saturday June 23th 1838

Commences with moderate breezes from the S. S. W. with a heavy swell running steering E. S. E. by compass. turned the reefs out of the Top Sail at the S. S. W. middle part light airs & calms later part a moderate breeze from the S. W. with fine pleasant weather so ends.

Lat by Obs. 39° 15' Long by Obs. 25° 25'

Sunday June 24th 1838

Commences with a fresh breeze from the S. W. with fair weather steering E. S. E. middle and latter part wind at South with cloudy weather all necessary sail set by the wind to the best advantage so ends.

Lat by Obs. 39° 02' Long by Obs. 32° 55' West.

Monday June 25th 1838

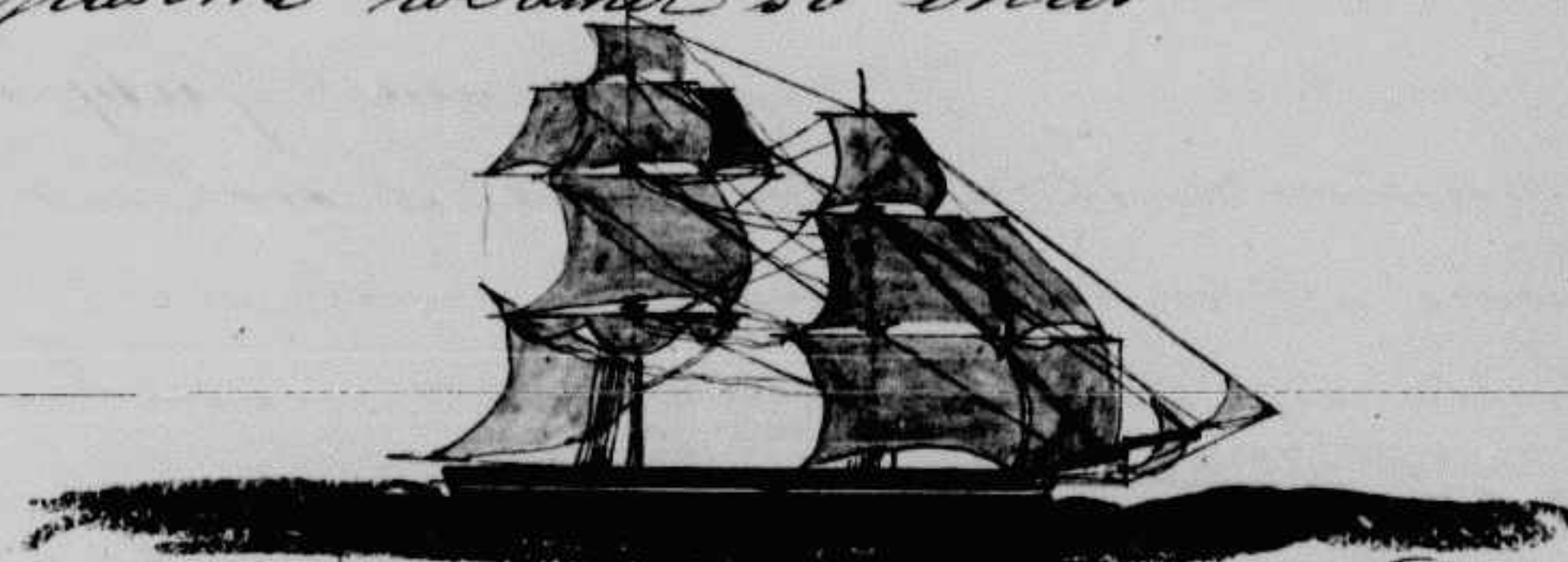
Commences with a fresh breeze from the S. W. with fair weather steering E. S. E. at 3 P. M. kept off East at 6 P. M. made Flores bearing East by compass about 40 miles distant. at 7 took in the Main Sail & J. S. L. at 8 saw a Ship at 8 halled up the Fore Lark & wore Ship to the S. W. at 12 midnight wore back again at 3 A. M. made all sail at 8 A. M. it shot in thick shortened sail and headed off shore at 10 it lighted up stood in and made all sail. a Ship in sight so ends.

Ship Courier from New Bedford towards the Pacific

Tuesday June 25th 1838 Commences

with a light breeze from the Westward with cloudy weather at 2 P. M. took a bl of bl in to the boat and went on shore to see if we could procure any vegetables found we were most to soon they had not got the dug. At 6 P. M. the wind halled round to the Eastward and rained at 7 got on board with the boat wore Ship off shore & put 2 reefs in the Top Lark at 8 took in the Main Lark Jib & Spanker at 11 the weather cleared up at day light made all sail at 3 A. M. spoke the Brig Pennsylvania from Gibraltar bound to Philadelphia sent letters by her at 9 wore Ship to the S. E. later part moderate breezes & fine pleasant weather so ends.



Wednesday June 26th 1838 Commences

with fresh breezes from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tack aboard of from the Land at night shortened sail middle part much as the first at daylight made all sail at 1 P. M. took in for the Land later part moderate pleasant weather variously employed so ends.

Thursday June 28th 1838

Commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward steering in for the land at 1 P. M. took in the light Lark at 4 luffed the Ship to the wind to the South at 12 midnight wore Ship at daylight made all sail latter part wore light breezes from the South with fine pleasant weather 3 Ships & a Bark in sight so ends this day.
