Wednesday Oct^r. 10th. 1838 Commences
with a fresh breeze from W by S. steering E. S. E. with all
mainsail set, with fair weather employed repairing the fore
& S. Sails at 6 P.M. bent it. 30. middle part light, air latter part
moderat breezes at Noath with fine pleasant weather. so ends.
Lat by Oct^r. 40. 50. S Long by Oct^r. 100. 14 East.

Lat by Obsⁿ 40-53 Long by Chrtⁿ 100-14 East.

Thursday Oct^r. 11th. 1830 Commences
with strong breezes from North with fair weather starting E. & S.
with all drawing sail set to the best advantage middle part
thick foggy weather took in the Huring Sails at 3 A.M. and then
again latter part strong breezes with cloudy weather so ends
Lat by Obs. 41° 23' Long by Obs. 104° 40' East.

Friday Oct^r. 12th 1830 Commences
with strong breezes & squalls at 1 P.M. took in the Storing
Sail's Top Gallant Sail's & put 1 reef in the Top Sail's at 6 P.M.
doubled reefed the Top Sail's at 9 took in the 3^d abore reef
& the Fore Top Sail took in the Main Sail at 4 A.M. split the
Main Top Sail furled it at 5 A.M. went it to repair
latter part strong gales at North stering E. N. E. employed
repairing the Main Top Sail in the Stewage thick raining
weather at 11 it began to moderate turned 2 reefs out
of the Fore Top Sail so ends No observation.

Saturday Octr 15th 1838 Commences
with a fresh breeze from the NW with cloudy weather
steering E by S. In middle part wind to NW. West to NW
with fair weather at 8 AM the wind hauled to NW & took in
the standing sail. Thick raining weather at 11 the wind hauled
out to the westward and cleared off pleasant wth the steering
sail so ends. Lat by Obs^y 41° 48'. Long by Est^y 118° 56' East.

Sunday Oct. 14th 1830 Commences
 with strong breezes from the W & W with fair weather
 starting 6th I with all drawing sail at middle part
 thick foggy took in the standing sails at daylight at hour
 latter part more pleasant so ends. Lat by Obs 41. 45 Long by Alt. 118. 20 E

Monday Oct. 15th 1870 Commenced
with a strong breeze from the N.W. & with fair weather steering
E by S with all drawing sail set to the best advantage made
port much the same at 9 A.M. took in the S. S. Tacking Sails at 9 took
in the Top Mast Tacking Sails and Fore & Top Sails latter part fresh gales
with clear weather at 2 put 2 reefs in the Fore Top Sails so ends
Lat by Obs'n 41° 46' Long by Chart 121.00 East.

Tuesday Oct-15th 1850 Commenced with fresh gale from the Westward with squally weather but a reef in the Main Top Sail took in the Mizzen middle part much the same latter part more moderate turned the reef out into the Top masts & F. G. Standing Sails so ends with fair weather.
Latitude by Obsⁿ. 41° 58' Long by Obsⁿ. 125° 24' East.

Late by Obs. 41-50 Long by Cht. 125-29 East

Wednesday Oct. 14th 1858 Commenced
with a strong breeze at N.E. during E.D.P. at 3 P.M. the wind
belled more to the North shifted the Tiding Sails over midships
part strong breezes with fair weather latter part much the same
all drawing Sails up to the best advantage. so ends.
Lat by Obs. 42.21 Long by Obs. 129.26 East.

Thursday Oct. 10th 1838 Commenced
with a strong breeze from the N.W. with fair weather steering S by E
with all drawing Sails set to the best advantage, at 10 P.M. hauled in
the lower Sailing Sails at 1 P.M. the wind hauled N.W. at 8 A.M. took
in the S.S. Sailing Sails at 9 took in the Top mast standing Sails &
Top I Sails half past 11 put 2 reefs in the Top Sails saw no wind fresh
gales and thick weather so ends got a Lat by Double Altitudes
made the Lat 43° 02' Long by Chron. 193° 42' East

Tuesday, October 10th 1832 Commences
 with fresh gales from S.W. with thick weather rising
 E. by S. at 4 P.M. becomes moderate and halts on one to the Westward.
 Turned a reef out of the main top. Put up the N. T. S. Sail on middle part
 which wind from the Westward at daylight the wind halts to the S.W.
 Turned the reefs out made all Sail at 9 put 2 reefs in the top but is
 no cords in the fresh gales from South Sail by Oct. 11. Long by Alt. 132.0
