

125 Ship Courier while at Anchor in the Port of ^{Hollulu}

Saturday Nov: 23th 1839 Commences with brisk trades & fair weather middle part much the same but part took one raft of water off so ends

Sunday Nov: 24th 1839 Commences with brisk trades one watch on liberty at sunset they returned middle part Calm saw a Ship in the offing at 4 A.M. she came too it proved to be the Charles Henry of Nantucket 2 months out with 1000 bls. latter part light airs & calms nearly all hands on liberty so ends.

Monday Nov: 25th 1839 Commences with light airs and calms the watch on liberty ~~the afternoon~~ at sunset they came off middle part much as the first in the morning sent a raft of Cask on shore for water and brought off a small one latter part light baffling weather one watch on liberty the remainder employed stowing water and various other jobs. A Ship in the offing so ends

Tuesday Nov: 26th 1839 Commences with a light sea breeze at 3 P.M. the Ship Lancaster of New Bedford arrived about 12 noon the out with 700 bls. at 4 we sent another raft of Cask on shore for water at sunset the liberty men came off. middle part light airs & calms at 8 A.M. took all our water on board then sent one watch on shore latter part in. played stowing away water and painting the bends. so ends.

Wednesday Nov: 27th 1839 Commences with light baffling winds at sunset the liberty men come off all excepting John R. Thortright which deserted middle part the weather much as the first latter part the same one watch on shore the other employed taking off recruits so ends

Thursday Nov: 28th 1839 Commences with light airs & calms employed stowing away vegetables at sunset sent the boat for liberty men all came off but J. C. Whitney ~~the~~ ~~middle part~~ ~~much as the first~~ ~~latter part~~ ~~light~~ ~~from~~ ~~that~~ ~~have~~ ~~short~~ ~~shipped~~ ~~4 natives~~ ~~got~~ ~~all~~ ~~ready~~ ~~for~~ ~~at~~ ~~last~~ ~~our~~ ~~anchor~~ ~~stood~~ ~~out~~ ~~so~~ ~~ends~~

Friday Nov: 29th 1839 Commences with light airs & calms with fine pleasant weather the watch employed clearing the decks at 5 sent the Boat for the liberty men, all came off but J. C. Whitney the Insider. middle part much as the first latter part light air from the West ward have short got all ready for sea went on shore and shipped 4 natives at 12 took our Anchor & stood out so ends.

Saturday Nov: 30th 1839 Commences with fair weather about 5 P.M. took the trades kept off West at 6 P.M. put 2 reefs in the Top Sails. at 12 midnight were Ship off shore back off Kowhai at 7 A.M. went on shore with the boat remainder of the day ~~Ship~~ lying off & on with a boats crew on shore so ends. the following Ships at Calne Marcus Fair Haven 1900 bls 300 the season Here of Nantucket 400 bls 500 the season Mariner of Nantucket 1800 bls 400 the season & the Water Scott back of the bar wanting 100 bls to fill put letters on board of her.

Sunday Dec: 1st 1839 Commences with brisk trades from the Eastward at 4 P.M. got through with my business on shore took up the boat kept off South with the Main Top. I Sail at 7 the wind backed on took it in again. middle part brisk winds from N.E. with fair weather steering South latter part more moderate with the Main Sail turned the reefs out of the Top Sails so ends Lat by Obs: 19.41 N Long by Obs: 153.10 West

Monday Dec: 2nd 1839 Commences with brisk trades from the Eastward with fair weather steering by the wind with the larboard tack aboard at 4 P.M. luffed too and put the Starboard boat out took the other in took in the M.T. Sail put one reef in the Top Sails middle part brisk gales put another reef in the Top Sails took in the 2nd of Main Sail latter brisk gales from E.N.E. with cloudy weather heading up & E. a very bad sea on so ends
