Wednesday February 2nd 1842

All these 24 hours light airs and calms standing to the North. Whores of the 24 saw Porpoises so ends Lat by Obs. 1.15 South

If I did not see the ship I made the Log 134.10

Thursday Feb. 3rd 1842 All these

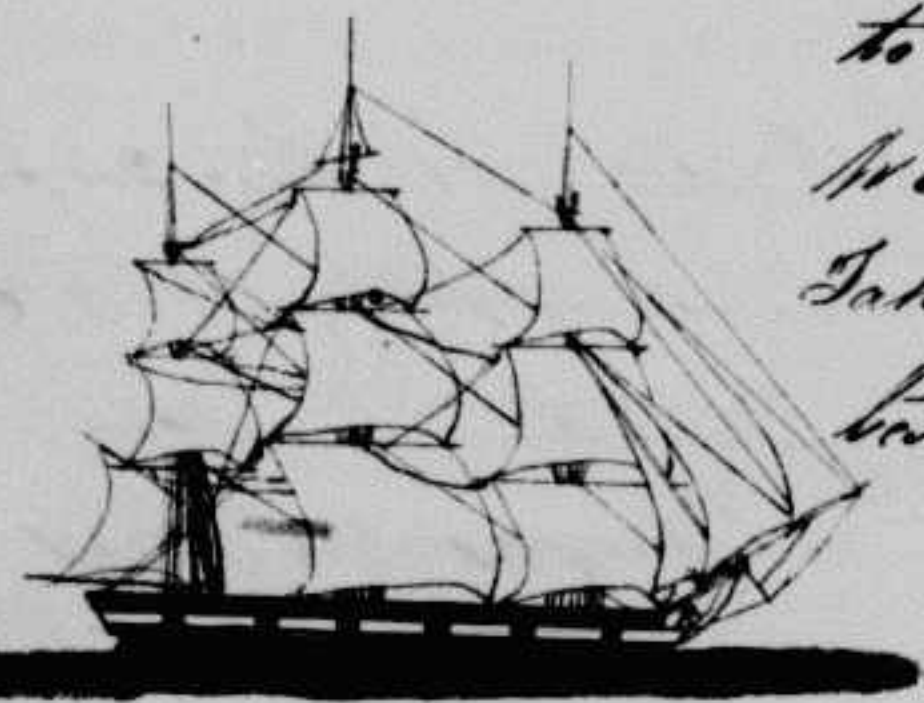
24 hours light airs and calms good many Porpoises in sight but nothing that looks like Whales so ends

Lat by Obs. 1.31 S Long 134.12 West

Friday Feb. 4th 1842 Commences

with a very moderate breeze from the E.S.E. with pleasant weather standing to the N.E. middle part much at the same at day light tacked to the S.E. at 9 A.M. spoke the Ship Salen of Norin Det. 40 m on the out 1700 lbs. bound to Tahiti then home put letters on board of her better part wind at East so ends

Lat by Obs. 1.12 South Long by Obs. 134.54



Saturday Feb. 5th 1842 All these

24 hours moderate trades from the Eastward with fair weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard so ends

Lat by Obs. 1.59 Long by Obs. 134.36

Sunday Feb. 6th 1842 All these 24

hours moderate trades with pleasant weather standing to the South saw a great many Porpoises so ends Lat by Obs. 1.39 Long 134.54

Monday Feb. 7th 1842 All these

24 hours very moderate trades first part standing to the South middle & latter part standing to the North saw Porpoises so ends

Lat by Obs. 1.35 South Long by Obs. 135.31

Tuesday Feb. 8th 1842 Commences

with a very light air standing to the North middle part much at the same at 1 A.M. tacked to the South latter part moderate pleasant weather so ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs. 1.22 S Long by Obs. 136.00

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Wednesday Feb. 9th 1842 All

these 24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the Larboard tacks aboard in play fitted one of the Hobstays so ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs. 2.55 S Long by Obs. 136.16

Thursday Feb. 10th 1842 First

and middle part of these 24 hours brisk trades standing to the N.W. & latter part moderate so ends Lat by Obs. 1.42 Long 136.25

Friday February 11th 1842 All these

24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard so ends Lat by Obs. 1.33 Long 136.52

Saturday Feb. 12th 1842 All these

24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S.E. so ends Lat by Obs. 1.45 Long 136.54

Sunday Feb. 13th 1842 Commences

with a moderate trade from the E.N.E. standing to the S.E. at 6 P.M. tacked to the North middle and latter part light airs and calms so ends Lat by Obs. 1.46 Long by Obs. 137.20 West

Monday Feb. 14th 1842 All these

24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard so ends

Lat by Obs. 57 miles S Long by Obs. 137.53

Tuesday Feb. 15th First part of

these 24 hours moderate trades standing to the N.E. middle part very strong trades latter part nearly calm at 11 A.M. veered Ship to the South so ends Lat by Obs. 1.21 S Long by Obs. 137.57 West

Wednesday February 16th 1842

All these 24 hours moderate trades with thick muggy weather steering by the wind to the South East so ends

Lat by Obs. 1.21 Long by Obs. 138.10 West
