fine weather was employed clearing
away the wreck at 8 P.M. set the watch
middle and latter part fine weather
employed boiling all hands at 6 A.M.
steered S.W. by S saw several ships

Monday Jan 8th Begins with fine
weather wind North course S.S.W.
saw several vessels spoke the brig
Mary Elizabeth and ship Herald
all hands employed boiling middle
and latter part fine weather saw nothing

Tuesday Jan 9th Begins with fine
weather wind 8 course S.E. employed
boiling middle and latter part fine
weather finished boiling

Lat 38° 50' S Long 51° 40' W

Wednesday Feb 10th Begins with light
winds from North course S.S.W. employed
clearing up and washing decks started two
casks of water from main hole took one
cask of bread from there and put it amidships
middle and latter part strong breezes from
N.W. at 4:30 A.M. commenced coopersing
luffed the ship by the wind on starboard
tack heading West started a bbl of Beef

Lat 39° 40' S Long 52° 40' W

Thursday Jan 11th Begins with strong
breezes from N.W. was employed stowing
down in main hole at 7:10 Steered South
middle and latter part fine weather employed
stowing down

Friday Jan 12th Begins with fine weather
wind light and variable finished stowing
down and washed off middle and latter
part fine weather all sail set course
S.E. by W sent down the main royal yard
