

Thursday May 17th Begins with strong breeze
course N.W. by N. employed variously saw
nothing middle part fog latter part
moderate winds from E saw nothing

Friday May 18th Begins with strong
breeze from E course N.W. by N. saw
nothing put up the cabin store middle
and latter part a heavy gale from S.E. to S.W.
was running N.W. by N. making very good
weather of it

Lat 43° 45' N Long 172° 03' E

Saturday May 19th Begins with a heavy
gale from S.W. course N.W. by N. at 7 P.M.
close reefed the main topsail and reefed
the fore sail. Blowing heavy in squalls
at 2 P.M. killed and dressed the bullock
middle and latter part a gale from S to W

Lat 45° 40' N Long 171° 20' E

Sunday May 20th Begins with a
gale from N.W. was laying to under
a close reefed main topsail and foresail
saw nothing at night moderating
middle and latter part a gale was under
a close reefed main topsail and foresail

Lat 47° 30' N Long 171° 55' E

Monday May 21st Begins with a gale moderating
set fore topsail saw a number of fin backs
middle part the wind veering to the S. and E
latter part a gale from E.N.E. to N

Lat 48° 48' N Long 169° 50' E

Tuesday May 22nd Begins with a gale from
N. veering to N.W. at night took in the
fore topsail ship on port tack heading N.W. by E
middle and latter part a gale of wind from N

Lat 49° 04' N Long 170° 12' E

Wednesday May 23rd Begins with moderating
weather at night gale to moderate set a whole
topsails saw nothing, broke out for water
middle and latter part fine weather employed
variously

Lat 49° 42' N Long 170° 16' E

Thursday May 24th Begins with light air
and calm employed variously saw several
fin backs middle and latter part calm
and light air saw several fin backs

Lat 49° 52' N Long 169° 44' E

Friday May 25th Begins with fine weather
at 7 P.M. a light breeze from E.N.E. course
N.W. by N. made a line tub and overhauled
a cask of potatoes middle and latter part
fine weather wind N.E. light course N.W. by N.
