

Saturday May 26th Begins with light
Easterly wind, course N. N. W. saw
several fin backs employed cautiously
middle and latter part strong breezes from E. N. E.
saw a great many fin backs

Lat 53° 10' N Long 167° 46' E

Sunday May 27th Begins with a gale
from E. N. E. stowed N. N. W. under close reefed
main top sail and foresail until 7 P. M. then
took in the foresail and hove to took the
oars and craft out of the boats and hoisted
the boat to the davit heads and lashed them
there at 8 P. M. blowing heavy middle and latter
part moderating rain and fog

Lat 53° 50' N Long 166° 00' E L. C. R.

Monday May 28th Begins with fog weather
wind strong but moderating from E. N. E.
at 4 P. M. set reefed foresail ship on the
starboard tack heading North middle part
fog at 5.30 set double reefed topsails
at 4.30 saw the land Behring's Island
latter part was running along on the
west side weather changing

Lat 53° 18' N Long 165° 45' E

Tuesday May 29th Begins with misty weather
at 2 P. M. passed the N. end of the island
the wind N. E. at 7 P. M. took in the
main top gallant sail and flying jib weather
fog middle and latter part strong breezes from
N. E. was on the starboard tack weather snow and rain

Lat 56° 30' N Long 164° 46' E

Wednesday May 30th Begins with strong breezes
from N. E. heading Northward at 3 P. M. hove
ship to the Eastward weather fog wind strong
but moderating started water 200 gallons
middle part snowing latter part strong breezes
and squalls from N. with saw nothing

Lat 55° 48' N Long 166° 25' E

Thursday May 31st Begins with moderate weather
at 6 P. M. snowing wind North steering by it
on port tack saw nothing middle and latter
part moderate with light squalls wind from
North ship on port tack saw nothing

Lat 55° 46' N Long 168° 10' E

Friday June 1st Begins with light fog
squalls from N. was on the port tack saw
nothing at 7 P. M. took in the top gallant sails
and gall topsail middle and latter part strong
breezes from N. was on the port tack
