

Tuesday June 26<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong breeze  
from S E finished boiling & an General ships  
but no whales at 9 P.M. saw ice to windward  
along shore worked up to it then lay aback  
spoke thro J. C. West and the George

Wednesday June 27<sup>th</sup> Begins with fog weather  
wind S E stood down the ice was working  
Southward through the ice at 8 noon ship  
to Northward & an no whales middle and  
latter part strong breeze from S E was working  
about in the ice saw 15 ships and the  
land 12 miles off Cape Behring bearing S E by S  
Starb. Cash Bark 5 bells

Thursday June 28<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong  
breeze from S E was working around in  
the ice spoke the Joseph C. Marshall  
the fog lifted and we saw the Daniel Wood  
stolen with several ships around her stood  
near her and the Capt. ~~Robert~~ on board  
at 2 P.M. came to anchor in the ice  
12 fms water furl'd the sails middle  
and latter part was laying at anchor the  
wind being strong from S S E the ice thin

Friday June 29<sup>th</sup> Begins with fresh  
breezes the stolen ship got underway and  
steered to the N W for a harbor at the dist  
of 6 miles set his signal half mast got  
underway and ran for him saw him go into  
a harbor with 7 ships then hauled on the wind  
S W along the land middle and latter part  
fog was working around in the ice.

Saturday June 30<sup>th</sup> Begins with fog weather  
was working around in the ice until 1 P.M. then  
anchored in 15 fms water with 30 fms chain  
middle part fog latter part fine weather  
employed scraping bone

Sunday July 1<sup>st</sup> Begins with fine weather  
was laying at anchor in heavy ice the Capt. went  
on board the Oliver Crocker at 6 P.M. saw  
three bowheads downed but did not get near  
them middle and latter part moderate breeze  
from S W and calm the ice quite heavy jammed  
with the Oliver Crocker and Congress

Monday July 2<sup>nd</sup> Begins with fog weather  
the ice working in shore at 8 P.M. the ship  
in clear water with ice outside and in shore  
saw no whales middle and latter part a strong breeze  
from S S E with fog was laying in the ice  
at anchor saw no whales

Tuesday July 3<sup>rd</sup> Begins with strong breezes  
from S S E with the ice thick and heavy was  
employed keeping it clear of the ship as much  
as possible middle part the same and the  
latter part no different

Wednesday July 4<sup>th</sup> The same as yesterday  
only the ice heavier washed off saw 11 ships  
at anchor in the ice middle and latter part  
light breeze from S S E the ice thick and  
heavy here in 10 fms chain at 1 P.M.  
paid out again to 35 fms
