

Thursday July 5th Begins with light air from South was gaming with the Oliver Crocker the ice thinner than ever all the ships at anchor again 7 of them having been surrounded middle and latter part light breeze from Southward with fog the ice heavy

Friday July 6th Begins with fresh breezes from S E the ice thick and heavy at 3 P.M. the ice more open and lighter the fog lighted and saw 13 ships middle and latter part much the same started a keg of butter

Saturday July 7th Begins with foggy weather the Capt went on board the Oliver Crocker the ice quite open middle and latter part moderate the wind at 5 A.M. light from N.W. got underway and stood out for Cape Behring

Sunday July 8th Begins with fresh breezes from N.W. ran to the S.E. along the land in heavy ice at 7 P.M. came to with the boat anchors to a large cake of ice saw 13 ships middle part light air and calm latter part fresh breeze from N.W. was working through heavy ice to the eastward saw clear water started a cask of Bread

Monday July 9th Begins with fine weather at 3 P.M. got out of the ice saw something that looked like a spout lowered 2 boats found it to be a hole in a cake of ice steered S.E. by E along shore the land 20 miles off middle and latter part foggy gamed with the M^t Waliston course E.S.E. saw nothing

Tuesday July 10th Begins with foggy weather course E by N wind light from N.W. at 3 P.M. fell in with ice weather foggy hauled on the wind to Southward middle and latter part foggy wind variable saw 4 ships

Wednesday July 11th Begins with fine weather was near St. Lawrence Island wind East steered to the Northward at 6 P.M. spoke the Barde Trident Capt. went on board saw 7 ships middle and latter part calm broke for a cask of Beef 34 lbs and a cask of flour 64 lbs St. Lawrence Island leaving S. Dist 20 miles

Thursday July 12th Begins with foggy weather with occasionally a light spell was on different tracks wind light from E.S.E. saw nothing was employed making a fore stay sail out of an old lower studding sail middle and latter part foggy spoke and gamed with the Piper Perry

Friday July 13th Begins with foggy weather was gaming with the Piper Perry middle and latter part foggy was off and on the ice saw several ships

Saturday July 14th Begins with foggy weather at 2 P.M. the fog lighted up saw the end of the ice to the N and E ran around it and steered N.W. the wind S.E. by W strong at 6 P.M. set in fog took in sail and ran along easy middle and latter part foggy at 8 A.M. the wind hauled to the North stood in shore at noon saw the Commodore leaving N.E.
