And at 6 P.M. were ship off shore weather thick with snow and hail at night more moderate saw several Seal fish middle part fresh breezes from N moderating at 1 A.M. passed between Cape East and the Vinces. latter part fresh breezes from South course NW. Lat 69° 10' N at 5 P.M. Long 170° 06' W

Monday July 16th Begins with strong breezes from South course NW. all sail set weather large middle part raising latter part fine weather wind strong from SE. saw nothing course N. Lat 69° 12' N Long 168° 40' W

Tuesday July 17th Begins with fresh breezes moderating course NW. at 5 P.M. raised the ice in Lat 69° 45' N Long 168° 45' W at 6 P.M. steered N. by E wind veering to NW with rain middle and latter part foggy with a clear spell once in a while was working along the ice to the N. E. saw nothing

Lat 70° 12' N Long 166° 30' W

Wednesday July 18th Begins with foggy weather saw 2 ships to leeward spoke and hauled with the Roscoe and Milo broke out for water middle and latter part fine weather was working to the Eastward

Lat 70° 00' N Long 166° 51' W

Thursday July 19th Begins with a light breeze from N. E. with rain saw 6 ships at 13 P.M. steered NW saw no whales middle and latter part raising with strong breezes from N. E. trending Northward

Lat 69° 45' N Long 167° 30' W

Friday July 20th Begins with strong breezes from NW. N. was by the wind on the Starboard tack at night moderate saw 3 ships but no whales middle and latter part snowing at 6 A.M. were ship to Northward

Lat 69° 30' N Long 168° 04' W

Saturday July 21st Begins with snow weather at 5.30 P.M. saw the ice were ship came to with head yards aback saw nothing at 5.30 more to the Northward and ran along the ice middle and latter part fine weather was working to the N. E. saw 2 ships to leeward

Lat 70° 22' N Long 164° 44' W

Sunday July 22nd Begins with fine weather at 3 P.M. spoke and hauled with the Gen. Scott and Gen. Inoup was working to the N. E. middle and latter part fine weather saw several ships hauled with the St. George and Gen. Inoup
