

Tuesday Sept 4th Begins with fine weather at noon more ship to the S E at 1.30 P.M. spoke the Lydia gained with her and Oslander saw no whales course S E middle and latter part calm and light air saw no whales 12 ships & boiling

Lat 70° 40' N Long 169° 50' W

Wednesday Sept 5th Begins with calm weather washed off decks saw no whales middle part strong breeze latter part a gale from N N E was lying to on the port tack under close reefed fore and main topsails saw several ships but no whales

Lat 69° 48' N Long 169° 30' W

Thursday Sept 6th Begins with a gale from N N E was lying to on the port tack under close reefed topsails saw 2 ships middle and latter part a gale from N N E was on different tacks saw 5 ships

Lat 69° 28' N Long 169° 40' W

Friday Sept 7th Begins with strong breezes from N N E saw 7 ships but no whales was on different tacks middle and latter part strong breeze from North was on different tacks saw several ships

Lat 69° 20' N Long 169° 20' W

Saturday Sept 8th Begins with a gale of wind saw one whale lowered without success at 4 P.M. close reefed the topsails and hauled the foresail ship on starboard tack saw several ships middle and latter part a heavy gale was on different tacks saw one ship

Lat 68° 45' N Long 169° 00' W

Sunday Sept 9th Begins with a heavy gale from N E was on different tacks at 6 P.M. took in the fore top sail middle and latter part a heavy gale at 5 A.M. set reefed foresail whilst lowering it Manuel Brown fell from the fore yard striking the rail and went overboard was lost saw one ship at 7 A.M. more ship to Eastward

Monday Sept 10th Begins with a moderating gale ~~that~~ double reefed top sails fore and spanker was on different tacks middle and latter part fine weather saw one ship broke out a cask of Beef 5 1/2 lbs

Tuesday Sept 11th Begins with fine weather gained with the Arnolda saw 4 ships was working Eastward middle part strong breeze latter part a gale of wind was on different tacks saw quite a number of whales did not lower saw 2 ships
