

Wednesday Sept 12th Begins with a gale from N.E. was under close reefed topsails and reefed fore sail saw several whales and 1 ship did not lower middle and latter part a gale from N.E. saw 3 ships

Thursday Sept 13th Begins with strong weather wind moderating was on different tracks saw one whale going to windward did not lower middle and latter part fine weather saw a whale going to windward lowered without success

Lat 69.00 N Long 169.50 W

Friday Sept 14th Begins with fine weather saw a whale still heading to leeward lowered the bow boat got near him but he saw her and went down darted at him but he was too far off saw several ships whaling middle and latter part fine weather saw no whales saw 3 ships boiling one cutting and one with her boat down broke out for water

Lat 69.30 N Long 169.25 W

Saturday Sept 15th Begins with fine weather saw no whales saw 6 ships was on the Northern track wind N.E. middle and latter part fine weather with snow squalls saw a whale going quick to windward lowered but saw him again no more for ever

Lat 69.15 N Long 168.40 W

Sunday Sept 16th Begins with fine weather saw 3 whales which seemed to be quick lowered and got within about a mile of them and they started and to fell to windward. may the Beril catch them. middle and latter part fine weather at 6 AM saw 3 whales going quick to windward lowered but saw them only once after a long way off

Lat 69.30 N Long 167.50 W

Monday Sept 17th Begins with fine weather the wind N. was on different tracks saw no whales saw 7 ships middle and latter part saw nothing

Lat 69.20 N Long 167.40 W

Tuesday Sept 18th Begins with fine weather saw a large number of whales lowered the bow boat struck one the larboard boat struck 2nd boat and killed him took him alongside and cut him in middle and latter part fine weather saw several whales

Lat 69.15 N Long 167.30 W

Wednesday Sept 19th Begins with fine weather saw quite a number of whales lowered and the waist boat struck one the larboard boat struck 2nd and killed the whale took him alongside and commenced cutting middle and latter part fine weather finished cutting saw Cape Lisburne
