

Saturday Sept 28th Begins with a heavy gale from N W was under close reefed topsails and reefed fore sail saw 1 ship middle and latter part a light gale from Westward was working Southward spoke the Europa saw 4 ships

Lat 62° 05' N Long 182° 40' W

Sunday Sept 30th Begins with a light gale from Westward course S E at 5 P M saw the land West Shore Dist 50 miles was running in company with the Europa and 1 other ship middle part was laying slack at 5 A M saw Cape East ran into the straits saw the ice and steered to the S E along the edge of it at noon was up with the Easternmost end of it passed between the ice and Diomedes saw 12 ships 2 boiling

Monday Oct 1st Begins with fine weather was steering S by W passed with the Florida and Europa middle part fresh breezes from N E latter part a thick snow storm wind hauling to the N W was on different tacks saw some ice and 6 ships

Lat 64° 45' N Long 182° 15' W

Tuesday Oct 2nd Begins with a light gale from West hauling Northward saw the main land and St Lawrence Island at night heading S W under double reef and jib middle and latter part a heavy gale from N W at 10 A M steered S by W under close reefed main topsail and reefed fore sail saw 4 ships

Wednesday Oct 3rd Begins with a gale of wind at 3 P M saw the land now ship to the N E gale moderating middle part a light gale from N was on the Eastern tack at daylight saw the land bearing S W steered for the East end of St Lawrence Island mended the fore topsail and made sail saw 3 ships

Lat 63° 48' N Long 178° W

Thursday Oct 4th Begins with fine weather wind N W ran around the East end of the Island and steered South filled 30 barrels water middle and latter part strong breezes from N course S E mended the mainsail saw 4 ships

Lat 60° 10' N Long 170° 49' W

Friday Oct 5th Begins with strong breezes from N course S E spoke the Norman saw the Passar and 2 other ships mended the foresail middle and latter part strong breezes from N W course S E to South took in the bow boat saw 5 ships

Lat 58° 05' N Long 170° 50' W

Saturday Oct 6th Begins with fine weather wind N W course S E saw 6 ships one sailing middle and latter part fine weather at 7 A M took in the starboard boat and put the main boat on the starboard crains saw 1 right whales lowered without success saw the land

Lat 56° 45' N Long 171° 10' W
