Wednesday March 13<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong breezes from N.E. course N.E. W. set up the main topmast and top gallant back stays middle and latter part was employed etc. at the fore top mast back stays

Thursday March 14<sup>th</sup> Begins with light winds from E to S.E. course N.W. set up the main topmast rigging middle and latter part fine weather set up the fore topmast rigging saw nothing

Friday March 15<sup>th</sup> Begins with squally weather broke out for meat Beef 4 bbls Pork 54 bbls and 1 bbl. course N.W. W. at night the wind light and squally middle and latter part fine weather light air and calm

Lat 20.17 N Long 134.20 E

Saturday March 16<sup>th</sup> Begins with calm weather at 1.30 lowered 2 boats for a hump back saw one ship middle and fine weather wind E course N.W. saw one ship finished the fore staysail

Lat 21.38 N Long 132.18 E

Sunday March 17<sup>th</sup> Begins with fine weather course N.W. employed variously middle and latter part fine weather
