

Thursday April 18th Begins with fine weather at 2 P.M. saw the NW Cape of Nippon and as Deland stood in until 7 P.M. and then more ship off wind SE the man got in confinement middle part strong breezes from SE to SW latter part a heavy gale of wind from WSW saw the land

Lat 41.30 N Long 139.00 E

Friday April 19th Begins with a heavy gale saw the Deland Kaxima leaving SE at 7 P.M. SE wind WSW to W middle and latter part a gale from West to NW at 6 A.M. steamed off for the Straits and ran in

Saturday April 20th Begins with a gale from NW ran in and anchored in Hakodadi the Capt went on shore at 6 P.M. returned middle and latter part fine weather started water sent one watch on liberty

Sunday April 21st Begins with strong breezes from WSW one watch on liberty middle and latter part broke out between decks and stowed up a little

Monday April 22nd Begins with Easterly wind took on board 41 bags of potatoes one watch on liberty middle and latter part took on board 20 sacks potatoes sent 598 lbs flour on shore

Tuesday April 23rd Begins with strong breezes from Westward with rain at sundown the liberty men returned middle and latter part gave liberty took on board 10 sacks potatoes

Wednesday April 24th Begins with strong breezes from Westward one watch and liberty middle and latter part strong breezes from SW

Thursday April 25th Strong breezes from SW let go the 2nd anchor at night moderate took up the 1st anchor took in Starboard boat and put the Bow boat on the Starboard cranes middle and latter part strong breezes from Westward

Friday April 26th Begins with strong breezes from Westward received on board Mason a boat steerman who deserted at Honolulu middle and latter part light and variable winds received on board a Kaniaka John Sailor at 6 A.M. took the anchor and worked out of the bay
