

Ship Cyrus from England towards Cape Horn 1804

Monday August 20th Light Northerly winds and fair weather steering to the westward all of these 24 hours. The Land and Land end in sight throughout the time made & took in sail occasionally to keep with the Convoys People Employ'd as necessary. Sailed the Muskeets, pistols, &c. and made every preparation for Defence at noon the Land End bore N 28 E 10 Leagues distant

Tuesday 21st Commenced light Westerly winds steering to the Westward by the wind at 6 P.M. back to the Westward with the Wind at N N W. the Land end bearing N B E 5 Leagues Middle and Latter part light N Westerly air and fair weather standing to the S W. at Noon the Land End bore N 29 E 11 Leagues from which I take my Departure. at being in Latitude 50.15 North and Longitude 5.43 West from London. OBS. Lat 49.32
