Remarks on Board Thursday May 10
first of this 24 hours light Easterly Wind with thick
Rainy Weather the schoer by wind heading
East at sunset took in sail for the night
all middle part same at sunrise made all
sail heading to eastward ends with pleasant
Weather employed in breaking out saw nothing
to day

Remarks on Board Friday 11 th
first of this 24 hours light N E wind schoer by
Wind heading East by south with all sail set
at 6 pm hauled ship heading N W and N E
last part breeze strong Weather pleasant
saw nothing to day so ends this day

Long 54 = 14

Remarks on Board Saturday 12 th
first of this 24 hours light N E Wind schoer by
Wind heading N W with all sail set middle
part same ends with strong breeze and pleasant
Weather tried the pumps found the schoer
Leaking mastheads gland saw nothing

Long 60 = 8

Remarks on Board Sunday 13
this 24 hours comes in with strong breeze
at N E and rugged weather at sunset
took in flying jib and mainsail
middle part more moderate and pleasant
at daylight made all sail heading in
N W ends with light airs and
calms this 24 hours found the
schoer leaking 175 strokes

all this 24 hours light airs and calms with
Weather pleasant employed in mending sails
schoer leaking 175 strokes saw nothing

at sun down took in sail for the night
at midnight wind hauled to S W with
rain ends with strong breeze and rugged
Leaking 175 strokes Lat 30 = 53

first part of this 24 hours blowing strong
from S W middle heavy squalls with
rain latter part Weather clear
blowing strong saw nothing
Leaking 175 strokes course East

Remarks on Board Thursday 17
all this 24 hours moderate breeze at N W
with pleasant weather the schoer with all sail
set steering East saw nothing to day

Lat 30 = 32

all this 24 hours light wind from N W
at 2 pm loward three boats for pumpbock
at 6 pm came on board at sunset took in
sail for the night in morning made
sail heading to N E
