Remarks Saturday September 15
first of the 24 hours moderate breeze from
NNE with heavy swell from NW
by wind heading NW by W with all
sail set at midnight wind hauled to
NE on moderate breeze latter part strong
breeze steering NW one sail in sight

Lat 35 = 19
Long 67 = 37

Remarks Sunday 16

first strong at NNE with fine pleasant
Weather all sail set middle came
latter part light at East course NW by
N at 5 pm spoke index of New Orleans

Lat 36 = 54
Long 69 = 31

Remarks Monday 17

first light wind at East fine Weather
all sail set middle part light wind SE
latter from S to SW light steering
NW employed in ships duty

Lat 37 = 42
Long 69 = 50

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Remarks Tuesday September 18
first part calm at sundown light wind from
East at 4 pm the wind hauled to SW light
with Weather thick and rainy at 8 am wind at
NE moderate breeze Weather clear course
SW

Lat 38 = 16
Long 70 = 31

Remarks Wednesday 19

light wind at East with fine pleasant
Weather all sail set steering NW by N
Saw three sails all hands employed in
ships duty

Lat 39 = 19
Long 71 = 40

Remarks Thursday 20th

first part light wind from SE with fine
pleasant Weather with all sail set steering
N by E 1/2 E all middle part thick
and foggy Weather at 6 am hove to rounded
42 fathoms at 10 am wind at South
with thick rainy Weather rounded 30 fathoms
at noon saw Montack point bearing NW
distant 10 miles Weather clear steering SW
at midnight anchored in Sippican outer
harbor in three fathoms so ends this voyage
of five months and fourteen days in Schr
