

Remarks Saturday May 18 1861
first of this 24 hours blowing a strong breeze
from N^W with a short heavy sea at
1 pm took in flying jib at 2 pm saw
blackfish middle part strong breeze at
N steering of S^W with all sail set
latter part more moderate with pleasant
Weather past a Bark to northward

Lat 37 = 5
Long 73 = 42

Remarks Sunday May 19
first of this 24 hours moderate breeze at N^W
with fine pleasant Weather by wind heading
W^SW at sunset took in sail for the
night at midnight wind at N^E light
at sunrise wind at East light breeze made
all sail steering S^W with pleasant Weather
at 4 am toward three boats for blackfish
struck one at noon took him on board

Lat 36 = 30

Remarks Monday May 20
first of this 24 hours moderate breeze at S^E
with cloudy Weather at 5 pm took in mainsail
and foresail and flying jib set trisails middle
part thick and rainy with light breeze from
south latter part blowing a fresh gale
from S^W with heavy rain course S^E
No observer

Remarks Tuesday May 21 1861
first part blowing strong breeze from W^SW
with heavy sea the scho under storm sails steering
S^E middle more moderate with wind at N^W
with rain squalls latter part light breeze
at N with a heavy sea running at daylight
set foresail steering S by E

Lat 35 = 30

Remarks Wednesday 22
this 24 hours commenced with strong breeze
at N with thick rainy Weather the scho
under storm sails steering South by East
No observer

Remarks Thursday 23
first of this 24 hours blowing strong gale
from N^E with thick rainy Weather
the scho hove to under storm sails
heading N by E middle same latter
more moderate with Weather pleasant

Lat 34 = 1 or
Long 73 = 51

Remarks Friday 24
first part of this 24 hours blowing a fresh
gale from N^W under storm sails steering
S^E with Weather clear at sunset took in
jib hove to for the night all middle part
thick and rainy at am set flying jib
and foresail steering S^E employed in
ship's duty mastsheads maned saw nothing
this day

Lat 32 = 57
Long 73 = 16 min
