

Remarks Monday June 10th 1861
first of this 24 hours light wind from SSW standing
in for Bermuda with fine pleasant weather all sail
in sight middle part light air and calm at 6 am
boat went on shore latter part thick rainy weather
with light breeze at WSW at noon the boat came
on board with potatoes and onions

no observer

Remarks Tuesday June 11th
first part of this 24 hours light breeze from SSW
with weather thick and rainy clear with all sail
out steering SE by S middle part clear with wind
at SSE latter part moderate breeze at SSW
with squally weather by wind heading ESE

Lat 31 = 43
Long 63 = 11

Remarks Wednesday June 12th
this 24 hours moderate breeze at SSW
with dark cloudy weather with all sail set
by wind heading SE by E mast heads man
employed in ships duty so ends the day

Lat 31 = 42

Remarks Thursday June 13th
this 24 hours moderate breeze from S
with dark cloudy weather on a wind
heading ESE with all sail out

Lat 31 = 35

Remarks Friday June 14th 1861
this 24 hours strong breeze from SSE
with thick rainy weather on a wind
heading SE by E at 9 am took in
flying jib and reefed mainsail

no observer

Remarks Saturday June 15th
first of this 24 hours blowing strong
breeze from SSW thick rainy weather
at 8 pm took in foresail set trisail
at midnight wind shifted to SW blowing
strong at 4 am took in mainsail set trisail
ends with strong with weather more broken
the crew under trisails heading SSE

Lat 31 = 36

Remarks Sunday June 16th
first of this 24 hours light breeze from SSW
with weather clear with heavy swell running
middle wind at W with squalls of rain
latter part light breeze at W with
clear sky under storm sails steering ESE

Lat 31 = 12
Long 56 = 42

Remarks Monday June 17th
this 24 hours light southerly wind with
pleasant weather with all sail set steering
East employed in ships duty

Lat 31 = 36
Long 56 = 06
