wind at S S W blowing a moderate breeze
with fine pleasant weather by wind working
to the southward with all sail set five sails
in sight employed in ships duty

Lat 30 = 25
Long 80 = 31

Remarks Thursday 27
first part light wind at S W at sunset wind
at W with rain squalls at midnight moderate
breeze at S W weather clear by wind working
to S W ends with calm with rain squalls

Lat 30 = 00
Long 80 = 10

Remarks Friday 28
this 24 hours light air and calm with
pleasant weather

Lat 29 = 50

Remarks Saturday 29
fore part calm middle part light
breeze from W S W with weather
pleasant all latter part calm

Long 49 = 47
Lat 29 = 36

Remarks Sunday June 30 1851
first of this 24 hours calm and pleasant
Weather one sail in sight middle part
calm latter part light breeze from
S E saw grasshoppers

Lat 29 = 24

Remarks Monday July 1st
light breeze from S E with pleasant
Weather steering S W spoke scho-
courses of Providence three more sails
in sight employed in mending sails

Lat 28 = 30
Long 81 = 09

Remarks Tuesday July 2nd
first of this 24 hours moderate breeze
from S E at sunset took in sail
for the night with wind at East
at sunrise made sail steering W N W
one sail in sight

Lat 29 = 37
Long 82 = 09

Remarks Wednesday 3rd
strong breeze at N E with rugged
Weather by wind to Northward
at sunset took in sail for the night
at sunrise made all sail heading
North one sail in sight

Lat 30 = 21
Long 82 = 57
