first part strong breeze at south with thick  
rainy weather lying to under storm sails heading ESE middle  
part weather more broken with moderate breeze from SE latter  
breeze same with clear weather by wind to NE with all sail

Lat 33 = 58  
Long 47 = 15

Remarks Saturday July 13 1867  
first part moderate breeze at ESE  
with fair weather under all sail to ESE  
middle strong breeze with rain squalls  
latter same lying to under storm sails

Remarks Sunday July 14 1867  
first of blowing strong from ESE with  
thick rainy weather lying to under storm  
sails to NE

Remarks Monday July 15 1867  
first part blowing at gale from south  
with rainy weather with heavy running sea  
lying to under storm sails heading ESE  
middle part some ends with moderate  
breeze with pleasant weather under jib  
foresail main & mizzen sail heading ESE

Lat 37 = 02  
Long 45 = 18

Remarks Tuesday July 16 1867  
light breeze from south with fine pleasant  
weather by wind heading ESE with all sail set  
two sails in sight employed in ships duty

Lat 37 = 15  
Long 44 = 24

Remarks Wednesday July 17 1867  
light breeze from SW with fine pleasant  
weather by wind heading ESE at sunset  
took in sail for the night daylight  
made all sail steering SE saw nothing  
to day employed in ships duty

Lat 37 = 15  
Long 43 = 38

Remarks Thursday July 18 1867  
light breeze from SW weather pleasant  
by to Eastward with all sail set saw  
grampuses toward boats for blackfish  
three sails in sight

Lat 36 = 20  
Long 43 = 36

Remarks Friday July 19 1867  
first light breeze from West weather  
pleasant spoke brig Hopetown of  
Sippican all middle part calm with  
rain squalls ends with light breeze  
from W with weather pleasant toward  
boats for blackfish caught one two sails  
in sight

Lat 36 = 15  
Long 43 = 59
