

Remarks Sunday July 28 1861
commenced with strong breeze at 11 W steering
East with all sail set spoke schooner ~~off~~
provincetown rosewell king of fairhaven at sunset
took in sail for the night at 8 wind hauled
to NE blowing strong with rain ends
with blowing a fresh gale with weather clear
steering to SW under storm sails

Lat 35 = 51
Long 44 = 07

Remarks Monday July 29
blowing fresh gale at NE weather squally
steering SSW under storm sails one sail
in sight latter part more moderate set
lower sail at noon weather clear

Lat 33 = 18
Long 44 = 00

Remarks Tuesday July 30
first strong breeze from NE with rugged
weather steering S by W under storm sails
middle part more moderate with rain
ends with strong breeze from East at 9 am
toward three boats for sperm whales struck
one at noon took him along side



Lat 33 = 18
Long 44 = 26

Remarks Wednesday July 31 1861
moderate breeze from East with weather
pleasant employed in cutting in whale
saw breeches to SE under short sail
heading to SE

Lat 33 = 12
Long 44 = 13

Remarks Thursday ~~July~~ August 1
light breeze from Eastward with light rain
squalls bying to under short sail heading
saw breeches

Lat 33 = 18
Long 44 = 26

Remarks Friday August 2
light breeze from ESE with light squalls
weather under short sail steering WNW
at sundown took in sail for the night
through the night thunder and lightning
at sunrise made all sail with wind at SE
steering NE saw nothing to day employed
in storing down oil

Remarks Saturday August 3
light breeze from SE with fine pleasant
weather with all sail set steering NE
at sunset shortened sail for the night
by the wind heading NE at daylight
made all sail steering of NE saw nothing
to day
