Sch'r Admiral Blake on voyage a whaling
in Atlantic ocean

Wednesday May 14th
moderate breeze at N E with pleasant
Weather at 10 am got underway in riparian
Harbor at 3 pm saw many Land bore N E
distant 12 miles from that we took our
departure steering S by W

Thursday May 15th
moderate breeze from E N E with thick foggy
Weather under all sail steering S W by S
employed in ships duty

at 6 o'clock

Remarks Friday May 16th
first of this 24 hours light breeze from E
with thick foggy Weather all middle part same
all latter part calm with pleasant Weather
course S W by S

Lat 34 = 34
Long 71 = 25

Saturday May 17th
all this 24 hours calm with pleasant Weather
three sails in sight saw blackfish toward them
for them struck two took them alongside

Lat 37 = 12
Long 71 = 40

Sunday May 18th
this 24 hours light Easterly winds and calms
with pleasant Weather steering S W by W
three sails in sight saw blackfish toward
the boats for them struck three took them
alongside

Monday May 19th
first part calm with thick foggy Weather
middle part light breeze from N E W Weather
thick and foggy latter part strong from S W
heading in to S E employed in loading out
blackfish

No observer

Tuesday May 20th
fore part strong breeze from S W with dark
rainy Weather by wind heading S E middle
part light wind from Westward Weather
pleasant steering S W under short sail
latter part moderate breeze from N E
with clear pleasant Weather steering S W by
S three sails in sight

Lat 38 = 36
Long 72 = 41

Wednesday May 21st
first of this 24 hours moderate breeze at East
with cloudy Weather steering S W by S with
all sail set middle light wind from S E
thick foggy Weather heading W S W
ends with moderate breeze from S with pleasant
Weather heading S W by W with one sail in sight

Lat 37 = 33
Long 73 = 44
