sea running under short sail by wind  
heading E S E with smoky weather saw  
two sails to southward

Friday June 6<sup>th</sup>

all this 24 hours strong breeze at S with  
rugged weather fore part under short sail  
by wind heading E S E latter part made  
all sail heading SE by E saw nothing our  
day

Latt 32 = 14  
Long 70 = 39

Saturday June 7<sup>th</sup>

all this 24 hours strong breeze at S with  
rugged weather by wind to SE by E latter  
part thick rainy weather reef mainsail took  
in flying jib

all clear

Sunday June 8<sup>th</sup>

first of this 24 hours blowing strong from  
SSW under short sail heading to SE  
all middle and latter heavy rain squalls

Monday June 9<sup>th</sup>

first of this 24 hours blowing a strong breeze from  
SSW heading SE by E at 4 pm took in mainsail  
set trisail at sunset took fonsail and libb set  
fonsail blowing strong gale with heavy  
squalls of rain with pleasant weather &  
strong gale from SW under storm sails heading  
S by E

Tuesday June 10<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours moderate  
gale from S S E fore heading to SE at 3 PM  
last part of day light at 6 PM fore made  
of R. Davis last Cooper and taken with a  
saw in the S east middle part more  
moderate latter part at sunset made all  
sail so ends

Wednesday June 11<sup>th</sup>

first part of this 24 hours light breeze  
from S S E fore heading to SE at 4 PM kept  
to S S E at 5 PM passed the land  
at 4 PM passed again heading to S S E  
light breeze 4 PM miles distant at least  
saw in for the land for 4 miles north  
at 8 PM Capt took in storm sails  
Doctor who pronounced it a east breeze  
at meridian boat came with provisions  
so ends
