Thursday July 18th

This day breeze from S.W. Brig heading NW by the wind under moderate sail employed in ships duty & men sick

Friday July 19th

This day came in with calm weather at daylight sent down the upper topsal and repaired it at 5 P.M sent up again and set wind W. brig heading N. by the wind under all sail 5 men sick forward

Saturday July 20th

This day first part fresh breeze from W. at 7 a.m wind hauled S.W. and cleared off brig heading W. by N. under moderate sail 7 men forward sick

Sunday July 21th

This day fine wind to. steering W. by S. under square sails 5 men sick

Monday July 22^d

This day fine weather wind S.W. brig heading NW by W by the wind under all sail employed in breaking out ports and scraping masts 4 men sick forward

Tuesday July 23^d

This day fine weather wind S to brig heading W 1/2 S under square sails & stacals employed in scraping mast and doing other ships duty 8 men laid up forward sick one pretty bad

Wednesday July 24th

This day came with light air from S.W. at 9 a.m wind hauled W. 12 or noon tacked ship then brig heading N. by W. under all sail but top gallant sail and main topmast stacal 8 men sick forward employed in breaking out scraping & copart

Thursday July 25th

This day fine and pleasant wind W. all sail set at 8 a.m raised the land somewhere around the cape of good hope saw a steamer at a distance saw seal porpoise & sun fish employed in scraping booms and doing other ships duty 8 men sick forward

Friday July 26th

This day fine and pleasant wind S.W. steering W. by W under all sail employed in ships duty rone all the brass end for end 9 men sick forward
