

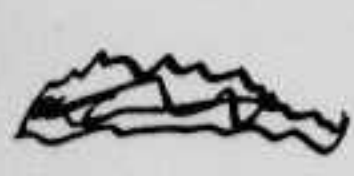
1808
June 30 Brig Daisy of New Bedford

 Tues 30. This day begins with very light winds from the E. the ship trying to get pass St Vincent middle part wind freshened so go by the Island at 7 o'clock sailed into the harbor of St Vincent and anchored the ship in ten fathom of water

Wed July 1st This day begins with strong trades ship laying with 60 fathoms of chain out on the Port heavy anchor cap to take the broken part of the windlass on shore to have it repaired at dark Capt. Le returned on board. latter part very strong trades

 Thurs 2 To day find us laying at anchor in the harbor of St Vincent. Cape Verde Islands Capt. Le. Shore getting the windlass repaired. trades fresh from the N East. so end the day Capt. Cleveland came on board at sundown

Friday 3rd

 This day begins with fair weather ship still laying in the harbor of St Vincent waiting for the windlass to be repaired latter part Capt. Cleveland came on board

Sat 4 This day ship laying in St Vincent with the American flag up in celebration of America Independence. just at dark took the anchor. had a steamboat to tow us clear of a steam mail all sail with the windlass patched up shaped a course for Brava & at a very mischance hit on St Vincent a good place to get shells.

 July 5th This day begins with moderate trades ship steering down towards Brava at 3 o'clock P.M. sighted the Island at 4 1/2 P.M. haled a back of near the Port and sent the boat on shore with the 2nd mate also the 2nd second mate to stay 24 hours latter part the boat returned to the ship. Capt. Le on board

Monday June 6 This day begins with fresh trades Capt. Cleveland went on shore left the ship laying off from Brava. so ends the day

 Tues 7 This day Capt. Cleveland came on shore board leaving the 2nd mate on shore Capt. Le shipped a Boatster so had to wait for him another day so ends the day. = " = "

 Wed 8 This day begins with strong trades Capt. Le. went on shore at Brava this morning and at 11 o'clock returned back to the ship with the 2nd two officers also a Boatster that he shipped with 2 two green men. then made sail and squared away for South. so ends the day. = " = " = "

Thurs 9th This day begins with moderate trades ship steering along S. by South Capt. Le gave out clothing to the green men that we got at the Island. set one sail latter squally. so ends the day Lat 13. 23 Long 24. 06 W

Friday 10th To day begins with very light baffling winds also rain squalls Capt. Le gave out oil clothing to the men, set sail Lat 13 00 Long 24 36
