Tues 14 This day begins with calm weather all through the day cats pass all around the compass at sundown light wind from the S. West. see 1 one sail
Sea 10.46 Long 26.21 West wooden back

Wed 15 To day begins with very light baffling wind with some rain ship on different tack working hard to get south see 2 two steamers
Sea 10.18 N no deuce

Thurs 16 This day begins with very light winds ship on different tack. see 12 steamers. also 1 sail. this is very slow getting getting to the south

Friday 17. To day we are still enjoying very light baffling winds also some rain. But 1 one sail at sea in the much busy at ship duty no deuce. See

Sat 18 This day begins with light wind from the West. middle part wind very baffling see 1 sail. at 3.30 PM raised a school of sperm whales ahead of the ship about 2 miles off going quick to the wind ward lowered 3 three boats and chased but soon had to give the whales up as the boat could not head for the whales
Sea 10.12 dead reckoning 5.10 N. Long 26.21

Sunday 19. To day begins with a plenty of rain and very light winds from the S. West rain rain all day very hard getting to the south sea 10.57 N. Long 26.21

Monday 20 This day begins with wind from the S. West ship on the starboard tack see 1 one steamer latter part ship on the Port tack heading West
Sea 10.42 Long 22.51 West

Tues 21 This day begins with very squally weather and heavy rains all day. wind from the West West
No observation. see one sail just at night steering to the south. see end the day. = " = " = "
