Frid 21 This day begins with breezes from the N East ship steering S West by West also rain through the day middle part began to change to the East at 2:30 PM the wind breezing on strong and haled to the S East so had to furl the light sails also the foretop sail by jib at sundown cleared up and looked more settled also moderated a little no observation. 20-2 mds

Sat 22. This day begins with moderate from the N East ship by the wind on the port tack see lots of finbacks the 3 three men still on deck. Leat 30.18
Long 41.34 West

Sunday 23 This day begins with very light winds from the N East and continued so all through the day
Leat South 29.52 Long 41.29 West

Monday 24 To day begins with very fine weather ship with 20 sail set from the North ship steering S by S West by West the square headed main sail and furling it below then bent the three courses one. So ends the day Leat 30.00 Long 43.02

Tues 25. This day begins with moderate winds from the North on finbacks also one p Pack of feed & some whale birds latter part wind very light.

This day begins with moderate weather wind from the North with light rain squall & some fog ship steering S by West latter part the same no observation. Killed a pig to day

Thurs 27. This day begins with wind from the S West breezing on at 9:30 AM furlled the upper foretop sail and put another reef in the mainsail at 11.00 am furlled the fore sail & jib wind haling more to the west. at 3:30 am wind west but set the main top sail no observation

Friday 28 To day begins with the wind blowing very heavy in squalls so in split the lower foretop sail quite bad also a bad sea running at 10:30 began to moderate some sea some sail at 3:30 PM quite moderate brok out another lower top sail and bent it so end the stormy day Leat 34.08 South Long 47.30 West

Sat 29. This day begins with calm weather ship laying with 4th sails cleared up 2 sails in sight. The work busy repairing the topsail we buried yesterday sent a letter and exchanged courtesies with the English Bark Solbadam Capt. of Sevier port. at 1:30 PM light wind from the North ship steering S West by West. so ends the day Leat 34.05
Long 46.35

Sunday 30 This day begins with fine weather ship steering S West one 2 sails also 2 large pieces of squid looked fresh wind from the North. So ends the day
Leat South 35.35 Long 48.45 West
