Monday 1st. This day begins with moderate winds at 9:30 Calm. 10th sail in sight at 1 PM wind from the East East latter part breezing on so furled the light sails and one reef in the mainsail luffed the ship up North so ends the day
Lat 36.13 Long 49.36 West

Sept 1st

Tuesday 2nd. This day begins with very moderate breeze from the East ship steering $\frac{1}{2}$ East. no observation Lat 37.44

Wed 2nd. This day begins with squally weather rain & fog. Wind from the East at 4 PM Calm see one sail at 6 PM wind from the South made a little sail ship on the starboard tack. the weather not settled. no Log. " " " "

Thurs 3rd. This day begins with strong winds from the South ship on the Port tack. at 9:30 A.M. rolled the ship around on the starboard tack at 10:30 set the foresail and double reef mainsail middle & latter part the same. so ends the day
Lat South 39.04 Long 49.34 West

Friday 4th. This day begins with squally weather & the wind backing and falling 4 to six points. see finbacks
Lat South 37.00 Long 50.06 West

Sat 5th. This day begins with winds from the East ship by the wind on the Port tack heading about S by East. every thing on ship board remains all right.
Lat South 40.00 Long 49.54 West

Sept 6th

Sunday 6th. This day begins with moderate S.E. Easterly winds ship steering S.E. East at 6:30 the wind haled to the N.E. East light so ends the day all hands well Lat 41.50 Long 49.30 West

Monday 7th. This day begins with fine breeze from the North. Ship steering S.E. by South. The wack repairing the fiber so ends the day Lat South 43.45 Long 47.45

Tues 8th. This day begins with winds from the N. West moderate at 3:30 the wind haling around to the West at 4 PM wind still working around to the S. West at 5 PM wind S.E. East began shortening sail & reef the mainsail saw 4 light rain the most of the day Lat by Dead reckoning 46.00 Long 46.00 West

Wed 9th. This day begins with very light winds from the South. At 9:00 A.M. light wind from the S. West see all sail the wack looking sharp for a Right Whale.
Lat South 46.56 Long 44.40 West



Thurs 10th. This day begins with heavy S. West winds ship hauled on the starboard tack at 10:30 A.M. moderated some in the squalls so set the foresail and some reef out the mainsail. hail squalls through the day also pass near a large Ice Berg. at 1 PM the wind freshened so furled the foresail again and another reef in the mainsail. Lat 47.02 Long 43.00 West
The weather quite cold to day
