Friday 18th. This day begins with good weather. wind E. at 11 AM 2 two boats went ashore and got one small load of Blubber. all hands busy getting ready for oil.

Sat 19th Like weather to day 3 three boats on shore to day killing elephants. also carried one boat ashore and haled her well up on the beach. and lashed her " " " "

Sunday 20th. Fine weather to day with light breeze. 3 boats still. Elephants go to large one to day. on the ship relieving over salt water.

Monday 21st light winds & thick fog. 3 three boats after elephants. all 3 three returned loaded and a raft beside. on ship began to mine also put ashore some Casks & the gasoline " " " "

Tues 22nd This day begins with the wind strong from the E. also a thick snow storm. gave the ship more chain. all hands on board mining. at dark more moderate.

The Island of South Georgia Cumberland Bay

Sept 23rd

Wed. This day begins with heavy winds from the W. Mt. also snow all hands on board mining. blubber ship at anchor in Cumberland Bay. South Georgia.

Thurs 24th To day begins with 2 small light Easterly winds began boiling at Cask of 500 A.M. began to snow hard and breeze on so cooled the work down. all hands began mining latter part moderated with fog and stopped snowing " " " " " "

Frid 25th This day begins with fresh winds from the N.W. 2 three boats on shore after elephants. at 11 eleven Casks began to fill. at dark all hands on board the boats have done very well to day 70 Cask of Oil tried out.

Sat 26th. This day begins with moderate Easterly winds with rain & two boats after Elephant. middle part wind haled around very light to the E. at 2 PM went 3th boat down to help bring the blubber. at 4.30 PM wind began to freshen at 7 PM wind strong and increasing all the boats got to the ship at 7.30 PM loaded.

Sunday 27th This day begins with fresh winds from the west. began boiling and cutting blubber at sundown cooled the work down. have 21 Cask of Oil full on deck. all hands on board.
