Thurs 8 This day begins with Easterly winds moderate 2 two boats after Elephant also sent 14 Cask on shore to make room to work in the ship's hold middle latter part show and wind fresh. at dark all hands on board. = " = "

Friday 9. This day begins with moderate Easterly winds also rain and fog 1000 boat after Elephant. at 7.30 the boat returned to the ship.

Sat 10 This day begins with the wind from the East also heavy rains and strong breezes at 2.30 P.M. the wind changed to the North some large pieces of Ice drifted in very near the ship at 5 P.M. wind N.W. and beginning to moderate. at end of the day we have had a considerable swell rolling in where the ship lays. = " = all hands on board

Sunday 11 This day begins and ends with very light Easterly air, or wind began blowing on board after Elephant at dark still the same Easterly weather & fog. 8 eleven good size Cask of Oil on deck. = " = " = "

Monday 12. This day begins with wind from the N.W. in squalls at 9.30 A.M. moderate some so began running down Ice also sent 1000 boat after Elephant. at 10 ten A.M. began boiling at 3 P.M. sent 2 two boats to bring blubber at 8 o'clock all 3 other boats on board with loads of blubber. and about 135 or 40 bbls of Oil on deck. latter part was light fog 11 M

Leaving at Anchor at the Island North Georges
Oct 13

Tues 13 This day begins with very light winds from the East sent 1000 boat after Elephant and Eggs. began stowing oil below at 9 A.M. squall with rain and heavy winds from the North managed to get the Oil below. then sent all the men that could work to advantage down the hole the rest sent below. the boat got back to the ship at 1.30 P.M. with some Eggs & blubber latter part rain all hands below. = " = "

Wed 14. This day begins with moderate winds from the North and light fog at 9.30 Clear all hands on board minding at dark light Easterly air. = " = "

Thurs 15. This day begins with Easterly wind light with fog & rain at 7.30 A.M. wind began shifting to the West finally got clear around to the N.W. then mist blown on fresh with snow 8 other steamer went in by mist for a harbor. they looked like whaling steamers. all hands on board. minding latter part moderated some the Barometer very low

Frid 16. This day begins with wind from the West also snow squalls occasionally at 10 ten thirty started to boil one boat after Elephant - latter part the same see the 2 two steamers pass out of the harbor

Sat 17. This day begins with light westerly winds & snowing sent 2 two boats after Elephant at 9.30 A.M. the weather looked better so began to hail at 3 P.M. began snowing hard so had to cool down. the boats returned with good loads to a raft beside
