Wed 13 To day it has been fine weather with light winds from the N.E. East ship on the Port tack heading E by 1/2 North
 Lat 29.21 South
 Long 41.02 West

Thursday 14 To day the wind has been very light from the N.E. East at 4 P.M. the wind haled around to the N.W. must light nothing doing to day
 Lat 29.02 S
 Long 40.13 West

Mon 15 very light winds latter part squally. Wind haled around to the S.W. must bend the foresail down and repaired it.
 Lat 27.45 S
 Long 39.37 West

Feb 16 1909

(Tues) This day begins and ends with very light weather. Went down the upper topsail and repaired it at dark bent the topsail again
 Lat 27.11 S
 Long 39.50 West

Wed 17. This day begins with strong winds from the north and breezing on at 7 A.M. furlled the upper topsail and reefed the mainsail. wind very fresh and the sea making latter part the same.
 Lat 26.40 S
 Long 40.05 West

Thurs 18. This day begins with fresh breezes from the N.W. but gradually moderating middle part with the light sails
 Lat 26.25 S
 Long 38.53 West

Friday 19. Calm weather ship laying with all sails clewed up. thing we may have a change by next January

 Long 38.00 West

Sat 20 Calm all day

Sunday 21 This day still calm at 6.30 A.M. light wind from the East
