Wed 24. This day we are still having NNE wind ship having a hard beat of it. the 4th mate is getting very bad cannot control himself. Lat 23.55 S Long 33.27 W

Thurs 25 This day the wind has been very light from the NNE Lat 24.26 S Long 33.08 W

Friday 26 This day we are enjoying a beautiful calm. and praying for a wind also for ~~patience~~ patience. Lat 24.00 S Long 33.27 W

Sat 27. This day the wind has been very light the ship is having very poor winds to get to the north. the 4th mate is very sick. Lat 24.20 S Long 33.42 W

Sunday 28 This day begins and ends with calm weather. saw sail in sight. also a steamer passed along in sight. on last night at 2.15 AM Charles Elizbeth died. at 6.30 Buried the remains.
