 Friday 2 This day begins
 with fresh trade raised the Lolland
 of Dominica at three o'clock this morning
 at daylight got the chains up and
 bent them on a 12 twelve came to
 anchor in the harbor of Portsmouth
 there were 2 bark & 2 type schooners
 laying in the harbor.

Sat 3. This day all
 hands washing ship & painting
 Ship laying in Dominica
 put 2 two men in the Hospital
 William Roberts & James Seamba

Sunday 4 This day begins
 with good weather ship laying in
 Dominica. The schooner Rosemar
 came in to day there is five whalers
 laying at anchor in this port to day
 also the schooner came had just gone
 to Rosemar to lay out her quarantine
 on shore to day in liberty.

Mon 5 Tues 6

Wed 7 In day it rain about
 all day with squalls

Thurs 8. rain very
 hard the most of the day

Friday 9

Sat 10. This day ship still
 laying at anchor in Dominica harbor called
 Portsmouth. Shipped 3 three men also
 put a lot of boxes on the articles besides
 discharging 2 two men.

Sunday 11 Ship still laying
 in Portsmouth harbor.

Monday 12 ship laying at anchor

Tues 13. Ship all ready for sea

Wed 14. got the ship under weigh
 early this morning and started for sea
 at 11. strong trade at 12.30 saw a school
 of sperm whales going quick to the windward
 no chance to haul.

Thurs 15. Ship sailing along with
 very strong trade passed Cornberian Island at
 11 Eleven a.m. to day ship steering N.W. by N. true
 Lat 15.52
 Long 63.46 West

Friday 16. To day the trade
 have been a little more moderate than
 they were yesterday. Lat 15.21 N
 Long 65.23 West

Sat 17. In trade to day
 see 1 steamer ship steering N.W. by N. true
 Lat 15.56 N
 Long 66.33 W
