July 1st Friday

This day has been very fine with moderate breezes from the N. West & on different tacks crossing have seen only grampas when we are going to see a whale
 Lat 32.20 Long 51.22 West

Sat 2.

This day begins with fine weather & we are steering into the
 3317 Lat 30.54 Long N. East with all sail set just at sundown raised a large sperm whale only we see him the son rising could not tell which way he was going dropped down & two boats thinking the whale might come up close to the boat, but soon called the boat to the ship then shortened sail Lat 30.17 Long 50.54

Sunday July 3rd This day good weather raised 3 large whale lowered 2 boats with stanch
 Starboard B1 and saw a large whale
 Starboard B2 got him alongside at 1130 AM
 Lat 33.32 Got the head off and body all in at
 Long 50.26 4.30 AM raised a school of small
 whales lowered 2 boats and set out
 got 2 small whales got them in long
 side at 930 in the evening a good day with

Monday July 4th 1921

To day we are blessed with good weather also moderate N. West winds began cutting in the 2 live whales. at 930 raised a school of sperm whales from the deck close to the schooner we could not lower as we had
 3319 The deck all full of blubber also a large
 3011 Head laying alone did to be taken care of after cutting the 2 live whales we had a very heavy head to get the case in.
 Lat 33.19 Long 50.12 In the whales were going down into the N. West

Tuesday July 5th This day begins with fresh breezes from the N. West the watch busy bailing & cutting blubber at sundown a nasty sea running but a reef in the main sail & when the port tack heading into the northwest
 Lat 33.14 Long 50.09 West

Wednesday July 6th To day we have had strong winds from the N. West also a number of rain squalls with a very bad sea running are still busy bailing by having small pots in the port the wind moderated a good lot we have the 3 live whales full of oil and now running into the fourth one Lat 33.42 Long 50.34 West
