

Aug 1921

Frid 5th

This day begins & ends with fresh breezes from the East & S. E. Cruising all the day & made no hauls. No whales seen. Lat 32 53 N. Long 49 55 W

Sat 6th To day the weather has been squally with light rains & calms. See papers but no whales seen. Lat 33 00 N. Long 50

Sun 7th This day begins with very light Easterly winds early this morning before breakfast raised a school of sperm whales going quick into the Southeast toward the other boats and chased on after the whales but the wind being very light the boats could not overtake the whales so they soon went out of sight to the windward & the boats had to give the whale up and return to the ship. See some sketches called it the cameo middle & latter part rain squalls. Lat 33 05 N. Long 50 20 West

Monday 8 This day we have squalls & rain all day. Wind all around the compass. No hauls.

Aug Tues 9th 1921

This day begins & ends with fresh East winds. Voke first part laying with two tryails, set middle part with the foreail discovered this morning one side of the gunnery strap had broken into so had to put a chain around the bowsprit & was to secure things forward. Lat 33 49 N. Long 51 10 West

Wed 10th This day begins with strong breezes from the East & S. E. Cruising with foreail & main tryails. Set middle part the wind moderated so set the main sail at sundown. Shorten sail. Lat 32 40 N. Long 50 52 West

Thursday To day we have had very light & East winds. S. E. on different compasses. Cruising. Lat 32 29 N. Long 51 12 West

Frid 12 To day we have had very light weather. Voke Cruising. See nothing so ends the day. Lat 34 43 N. Long 52 16

Sat 13 This day fine weather but nothing in sight. S. E. Cruising. Lat 34 27 N. Long 52 09

Sun 14 To day we are having light & West winds. Nothing in sight but a few steamers. Lat 33 32 N. Long 52 12 W
