

Thursday April 1st
 this day fine with fresh trades got
 timber back ready for water sent in
 eight but did not fill but then the
 water run very slow

Friday April 2nd
 this day fine with light trades steamed
 down about 77 fathoms water at night
 one watch on shore

Saturday April 3rd
 this day fine with light trades one watch
 on shore

Sunday April 4th
 this day fine with light trades sent in
 a raft of casks about 76 fathoms water
 a man repairing try works no watch
 on shore at night

Monday April 5th
 this day fine with light trades got watches
 right by water about 70 fathoms men on
 finished try works

Tuesday April 6th
 this day fine with light trades finished
 taking water took about 275 fathoms
 and took 24 sacks sweet potatoes
 and sack of onions

Wednesday April 7th
 this day fine with fresh trades finished
 up work and got ready for sea

Thursday April 8th
 this day fine with very light winds
 at 1 P.M. crew repaired to take water with
 two William Cook and Hudson
 took the men ashore and the
 ordered them all on board took water and came
 to work out of Bay wind died out and ship came
 to anchor in 70 fathoms water

Friday April 9th
 this day fine with very light trades took
 anchor at 1 P.M. and steamed out of
 the bay with all sail out at night the
 land about 10 miles distant

Saturday April 10th
 this day fine with light trades ship
 heaving 1 P.M. with all sail out
 but
 long

Sunday April 11th
 this day fine with very light trades
 ship steaming to the N.W. with all
 sail out at noon took ship and
 steamed to the S.E. had 14-59 S
 long 10-84 E
