Comes in with light airs from the W. and stormy weather. Ship by the wind to the N. N. W. under easy sail, at A. M. wore ship to the S. rain continues through the whole of the day. Nothing in sight but one finback.

Tuesday Dec. 4th

Comes in with strong gales from the W. and overcast. Ship by the wind to the W. S. W. under easy sail - kept ship S. W. and made some sail. Nothing in sight - some Gulf Weed with Tide Rips.
Lat. 32.44 N. Long 45.56 W.

Wednesday Dec. 5th

Comes in with strong breezes from N. N. E. and cloudy weather. Ship steering S. W. per compass for Dominica for water. Nothing in sight all day. Water blue with considerable Gulf Weed. Watch employed about ship.
Lat. 30.30 N. Long 47.24 W.

Thursday Dec. 6th

Comes in with strong gales from N. E. and somewhat squally. Ship steering S. W. with all prudent sail. Nothing in sight all day. Water very blue with large quantities of Gulf Weed.
Lat. 28.12 N. Long 48.50 W.

Friday Dec. 7th

Comes in with fresh breezes from N. E. and fine weather. Ship steering S. W. with all sail out - one sail in sight steering N. N. - Watch employed in repairing sails &c.
Lat. 25.57 N. Long 50.40 W.

Saturday Dec. 8th

Comes in with moderate N. E. trades and overcast. Ship steering S. W. per compass with all prudent sails. Nothing in sight all day but one finback. Watch employed in repairing sails and doing other work about ship.
Lat. 24.07 N. Long 52.40 W.

Sunday Dec. 9th

Comes in with light winds from N. E. and hazy weather. Ship steering S. W. with all sails out - One sail in sight steering to the W. Water clear and blue with some Gulf Weed. Nothing more in sight.
Lat. 22.54 N. Long 54.06 W.

Monday Dec 10th

Comes in with strong N. E. trades and fine weather. Ship steering S. W. by S. with all sail out for Dominica. Watch employed in setting up casks for water. Nothing in sight all day but two finbacks. In the P. M. nearly calm. winds light from N. E.
Lat. 20.09 N. Long 53.20 W.

Tuesday Dec. 11th

Comes in with light winds from N. E. and squally weather. Ship steering S. W. with all sail out. at 12 M wind changed to the S. with light showers of rain. In the A. M. saw Blackfish but did not lower for them. In the P. M. nearly calm. Nothing more in sight all day.
Lat. 18.59 N. Long 56.13 W.

Wednesday Dec. 12th

Comes in with strong breezes and squally weather. winds baffling from E. to S. with squalls of rain. Ship steering S. W. in the A. M. in the P. M. S. W. by W. per compass with all sail out. In the P. M. saw two sails one steering W. the other to the S.
Lat. 17.14 N. Long 57.45 W.

Thursday Dec. 13th

Comes in with light baffling winds from E. & S. E. and squalls of rain. Ship steering S. W. by W. per compass with all sail out. Nothing in sight in the A. M. In the P. M. baffling winds from the E. & S. E. nothing in sight.
Lat. 16.30 N. Long 58.58 W.

Friday Dec. 14th

Comes in with baffling winds from the E. & S. E. and light showers of rain. Ship steering N. E. by N. At 11 A. M. rained hard which proved to be Maria Gale. At 3 P. M. rained Dominica and lay to all night, close to.
