

Remarks on Board Thursday 7th July 1836

at 6 o'clock got under weigh with the wind S W and
bent to Sea all hands employed in working Ship and lashing
anchors and clearing the decks The remainder part employed in think-
ing of the Hardships we have got to encounter & Lat 40° 37' North
can't sighing for the Girls we left

Friday 8th July

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the East
all sail set standing to the South all hands —
employed in fitting Boats Middle and latter the same
plenty of Sails in sight Lat 40° 13' North

Saturday 9th July

First part of these 24 hours fine weather wind from the East
all hands employed in fitting Boats and Ship Duty Middle
the same latter took in fore and Mizzen Top Gallant Sails
and handed the Main Sail Lat 39° 35' North

Sunday 10th July

All these 24 hours fine weather wind a head saw nothing
all hands employed in Ship Duty nothing more remarkable
Lat 39° 55'

Monday 11th July

First part of these 24 hours light winds from the SE
all sail set nothing in sight all hands employed
in Ship Duty Lat 40° 17' North

Tuesday 12th July

First part of these 24 hours light winds from East
all sail set Middle & latter the same all
hands employed in Ship Duty

Lat 40° 39' North
