got 2 Blackfish & Matt Boats Lat - 39° 44' North

Thursday July 14th
all these 24 hours fine Breeze from the East steering
S.E. nothing in sight all hands employed in
Ship Duty Lat 40° 50'

Friday 15th July
all these 24 hours fine weather steering East
Several Ships in sight all hands employed in
Ship Duty Lat 41° 21'

Saturday 16th July
all these 24 hours fine steering East with
several Ships in sight took 2 Spanish Brier
Bound to Boston and Louisa of Lynn Bound
to East Cape Lat 41° 28'

Sunday 17th July
all these 24 hours fine saw nothing wind
from the N.E. with rain and squally
weather all hands employed in Ship Duty
Lat 41° 15'

Monday 18th July
all these 24 hours fresh Gale from the S.W.
steering E.S.E. pulled the Top Sails & the
Young Eagle of Nantucket bound to the South
Seas and saw 4 other Ships Lat 41° 45'

Tuesday 19th July
all these 24 hours a gale from the West under Clouds
Main Top Sail and Store 3 boats all hands employed
in Ship Duty Lat 41° 25'

Wednesday 20th July
all these 24 hours strong gale here too heading
to the South saw nothing all hands employed in
Ship Duty Lat 39° 39'

Thursday 21th July
first part of these 24 hours strong gale from
the S.E.W. middle the same latter part more
moderate set the Top Sails and Storing Sails
nothing in sight Lat 39° 27'

Friday 22th July
these 24 hours fine weather all sail set steering
E by S saw 1 Blackfish bound and took one
to the Starboard Boat Lat - 39° 15' Long 46° 17'

Saturday 23th July
these 24 hours fine all sail set steering E by S
all hands employed in fitting Boats saw a
hawk to theeward Lat 39° 22' Long 42° 25'

Sunday 24th July
all these 24 hours fine coast S.E. by E
all hands employed in Ship Duty 2 ships
in sight Lat 39° 30' Long 32° 30'

Monday 25th July
all these 24 hours fine saw a whales carcass
course E.S.E. all hands employed in Ship Duty
3 Ships in sight Lat 39° 39'
