Wednesday 27th Dec

all these 24 hours fine weather
ready for sea wind ahead so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 28th

First part of these 24 hours got under
weigh and stood down the Bay stowed the anchors and cleared
the decks & night took in sail heading to the westward
Morning made sail steering N.E. spoke ship Bombay of
London 11 months out 18th Dec

Friday 29th Dec

fine weather First part of these 24 hours
middle took in sail heading N.W. latter
made sail stood N.E.

Saturday 31st Dec 1836

fine course E. & N.E. middle and latter the same saw
nothing

Sunday 1st January 1837

fine course N.E. by E wind West middle and latter
part more moderate saw nothing

middle took in sail spoke the ship ~~the~~ Wallace 12 months
out 6th Dec latter part the same

fine weather spoke the ship Eggshell of Newport 15th
months out 1st Dec oil Capt Macy gained with her & took
in sail heading S.E. at daylight made sail in company with the
S. C. & saw a whale - hoisted in company the harbor boat
struck and turned him up took him alongside and cut him
in
