

Remarks on Board Ship Dartmouth from

Monday 30th Jan

First part of the 24 hours
saw no sail out middle part foggy with rain latter
moderate steering S.E. spoke ship Mary Mitchell, Clantucket
and gamed with her. Lat 31° 41' South
Long 125° 00' this day

Tuesday 31st Jan

First part of the 24 hours fine
middle and latter part thick with rain saw nothing in
sight. Lat 31° 37' South
Long 125° 00'

Wednesday 1st February 1837

First part of the 24 hours
moderate weather in sight middle gamed with the
M. Mitchell latter calm with rain saw 2 ships
Lat 32° 10' South
Long 125° 00'

Thursday 2nd February 1837

First part of the 24 hours
calm spoke ship Boston New Bedford 21 months out 500 tons
raised a pod of whales at sunset however without success took
in sail latter saw a ship
Lat 32° 10' South
Long 125° 00'

Friday 3rd February

First part of the 24 hours
24 hours fine weather heading to the North and took
ship to the S.E. and took in sail daylight made sail heading
to the N.E. & S. ship in sight
Lat 32° 30' South
Long 125° 00'

Saturday 4th Feb

First part of the 24 hours
fine weather middle and latter the same saw Bruch's
far off 2 ships in sight gamed with the Brighton
Lat 32° 06' South
Long 125° 00'

New Bedford in the South Sea Spinn Whaling

Sunday 5th February 1837

First part of the 24 hours
gamed with the Pacific Clantucket 31 months out 1800 tons
and Walmer, London 2 7 took in sail latter spoke ships
Mary Mitchell, Christopher Mitchell Clantucket wanting whale
James Munroe Hudson 1250 tons and gamed with them
Lat 31° 41' South
Long 125° 00'

Monday 6th Feb

First part of the 24 hours in
company with the above ship 7 ships in sight middle and latter
fine weather steering South and S.W.
Lat 31° 37' South
Long 125° 00'

Tuesday 7th Feb

First part of the 24 hours
fine weather middle and latter steering S.W. and S.E.
2 ships in sight steering to the S.W. nothing more remarkable
Lat 32° 39' South
Long 125° 00'

Wednesday 8th Feb

First part of the 24 hours
fine weather 1 ship in sight and 6 raised whales could not
tell what they were latter spoke ship Lydia of Salem
18 months out 750 tons sperm 300 whale saw nothing
Lat 32° 04' South
Long 125° 00'

Thursday 9th Feb

First part of the 24 hours
fine weather and took in sail and 5 P.M. made sail
in company with the Lydia steering East
Lat 33° 01' S
Long 125° 00'
