Thursday May 25th First part of these 24 hours fine steering to the S.E. Middle part calm latter part squally with rain spoke ship Whetmore of Calcutta of 100 tons out 110 tons Cattle Bunker and Gunpowder
 West Long by Chron 149° 23' Lat by Obs 12° 36' South

Friday May 26th First part of these 24 hours calm with squalls a night took in Top Sullant Sails in company with the 16 Middle and latter parts Moderate had a West Long by Chron 149° 43' Lat 12° 21' South Dream

Saturday May 27th First part of these 24 hours fine weather heading to the S.E. a night shortened sail daylight made sail heading to the S.E. Middle and latter parts the same

West Long by Chron 149° 00' Lat by Obs 11° 41' South

Sunday May 28th First part of these 24 hours fine weather saw a shoal of sperm whales that did not blow for them a night took in sail heading S.E. Middle and latter parts strong trade, heading to the North
 West Long by Chron 149° 14' by Lunar 148° 03' Lat 10° 52'

Monday May 29th First part of these 24 hours strong trades no sail out heading to the North Middle and latter parts the same with rain heading South
 Nothing more remarkable these 24 hours

Thursday June 1st First part of these 24 hours squally with rain heading S.E. Middle part wore ship the North latter parts the same nothing more remarkable
 West Long by Chron 149° 11' West Lat by Obs 10° 53' South

Friday June 2nd First part of these 24 hours squally with rain a night took in sail Middle and latter parts fine weather steering S.E. nothing in sight
 Long by Chron 149° 50' West Lat 10° 25' South

Saturday June 3rd First part of these 24 hours fine weather plenty Birds in sight Middle and latter parts the same Queen Caroline's Island in sight plenty of Birds & squid
 Long by Chron 150° 15' Lat by Obs 9° 57' South

Sunday June 4th Begins with fine pleasant weather and brisk breeze from the S.E. steering in for Caroline's Island at 2 P.M. lowered a boat to go ashore but without success a night took in Top Sullant sails and Double Reefed Top sails steering S.W.
 Long 150° 50' Lat 9° 42' South

Monday June 5th First part of these 24 hours fine weather steering N.E. Middle and latter parts the same
