

50 Remarks on Board Ship Dartmouth

Tuesday June 19th First part of the 24 hours fine with strong Trades Middle and latter parts squally sail jumps the Islands in sight Long by Chron. 170° 09' W Lat 14° 09' N

Wednesday June 20th First part of the 24 hours fine weather spoke the Hope of London Capt Pelly 32 months out 600 Tons Middle part laying off Sotterwiller latter part fine Lat 14° 26'

Thursday June 21st First part of the 24 hours fine weather cruising between the Islands Middle and latter part the same saw the Hobomok whaling Lat 14° 27'

Friday June 22nd First part of the 24 hours fine weather took in sail heading to the South Middle and latter part fine weather the Hope in sight

Saturday June 23rd First part of the 24 hours fine weather steering in for the land Middle hauled off latter backed in for Sotterwiller saw nothing boat came off Long 170° 48' W Lat 14° 14' N

Sunday June 24th First part of the 24 hours Capt went on shore Middle and latter part Capt on shore saw nothing remarkable at 11 came on Board Lat 14° 09'

Monday June 25th First part of the 24 hours fine steering to the S.W. 1 ship in sight Middle part the same latter steered to the S.E. Long 170° 26' by Chron. Lat 14° 26' South

Tuesday June 26th First part of the 24 hours strong Trades steering to the S.W. Middle part fine latter part backed ship to the North 1 ship in sight Lat 14° 41' South

Wednesday June 27th First part of the 24 hours strong Trades spoke ship Hobomok Capt Bulker with 235 Tons Middle and latter part the same Lat 14° 32'

Thursday June 28th First part of the 24 hours strong Trades the 16 in sight Middle and latter part calm some in sight saw porpoises Lat 14° 44' South

Friday June 29th First part of the 24 hours light winds Middle and latter part the same the 16 in sight 16 miles from the Island Lat 14° 33'

Saturday June 30th First part of the 24 hours light winds cruising around the Islands I took in sail heading to the S.W. Middle and latter part the same steering in for S Leone Lat 14° 33'

Sunday July 1st 1837 First part of the 24 hours fine weather canoes came off at night took in sail heading to the West latter part fine saw Branches did not ascertain what they were

Monday July 2nd First part of the 24 hours fine weather all sail set Middle and latter part the same saw Branches

Tuesday July 3rd First part of the 24 hours a heavy swell from the South saw Branches but did not ascertain what they were tacking to and from nothing more remarkable
