

62. Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth In

Monday 3rd October 1837 First part of the 24 hours fine took in sail to the S.E. Middle and latter part steering S by E S. Lat 22° 10' Long 173° 17' West

134 Tuesday 3rd Oct First part of the 24 hours fine steering South Middle part South. Latter part light winds later saw a large whale however without success Lat 22° 46'

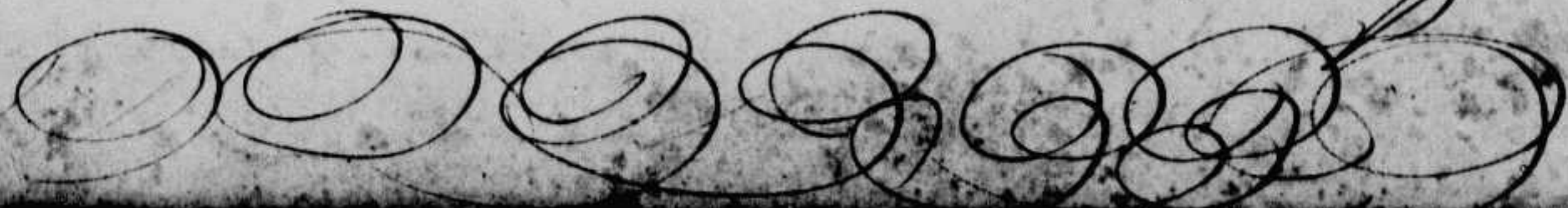
134 Wednesday 4th First part of the 24 hours saw whales however without success a 6 took in sail heading West Middle and latter part fine Lat 22° 14' South

Thursday 5th First part of the 24 hours fine 1 ship in sight a took in sail to the S.E. Middle and latter part rainy, steering S by E Lat 21° 34' South

Friday 6th First part of the 24 hours rainy spoke ship Uncas of Baltimore 36 months out 1500 tons took in sail to the S.W. latter fine steering West Long by Lunar 173° 40' by Chron 173° 59' Lat 21° 45'

Saturday 7th First part of the 24 hours fine Course W by S a 6 took in sail to the S. Middle and latter steering S by E and rainy some small bare W. Distances 20 miles made sail as required at 9 A.M. saw 3 ships at 11 A.M. spoke the ship Splendid of Exeter of 26 months 1100 tons Long 174° 20' S. Lat 21° 00'

Sunday 8th Begins with strong breeze S by E with a little rain at 5 P.M. part 60 with the Splendid at dark wore ship heading South & shortened sail Middle and latter part rainy heading S to S by E sail in sight No other this day

Monday 9th Oct 1837 First part of the 24 hours foggy rainy weather heading S by E winds from the E. latter part rainy with heavy rain latter under closed reef top sail heading S by E, ship in sight West Long by Lunar 174° 12' by Chron 175° 03' Lat by Obs 22° 11' South Tuesday 10th Oct

First part of the 24 hours strong winds from the S.E. under closed reef top sail a 6 took in fore & main 3 sails to the S.E. Middle part the same latter under doubled reef top sail 6000 in sight heading West Long by Chron 175° 10' Chron a few West by 40 miles Lat 21° 45' South Wednesday 11th Oct

First part of the 24 hours under doubled reef steering to the S by E a 6 wore ship to the South and took in sail Middle and latter strong winds heading to the S by E 6000 leaving at 10 No long Lat by Obs 21° 37' Thursday 12th Oct

First part of the 24 hours strong winds heading S by E spoke ship the Munroe and steamed a 6 wore ship to the South took in sail Middle part clear latter from moderate all sail out. Saw 12 miles Lat sent 2 letters Long 175° 30' by Chron 46 miles to far West Lat 21° 33' South Friday 13th Oct

First part of the 24 hours fine all sail out steering to the South I. M. in company 2 other ships in sight a 6 took in sail daylight made sail a 7 saw 2 whales lowered in company with the ship Munroe and struck to the bow Boat and took him aboard a 30. No other Lat by Obs 22° 18' 70th Saturday 14th Oct

First part of the 24 hours commenced cutting finished the body a 6 O.C. Head lay alongside through the night a daylight finished the junk latter thick and rainy commenced boiling No other Sunday 15th Oct

First part of the 24 hours rainy continued down spoke the Victoria of Sydney and wore ship and took in fore sail & main top sail heading to the South Middle commenced boiling Lat by Obs 22° 33' South
