 Tuesday 12th Dec
 First part of these 24 hours strong breezes and a heavy swell in company
 with the Cape Packet & sundown took in sail to the South wind E.S.E.
 Middle part more moderate & daylight made sail wore S. by W. all sail out
 Long 179° 04' W Lat by Obs 28° 23' South
 Wednesday 13th
 First part of these 24 hours fine all sail out bore S by W & sundown took in
 sail to the S.E. & took a full fish Middle and latter part calm
 Long 181° West Lat 28° 30' South
