Remarks On Board Ship Dartmouth
Friday 30th March 1793

First part of these 24 hours watch employed in h. setting yards in company with the Nuncas & 5 raised whals & 6 saw them again & 4 of Sailing rigged and to late to have took in sail to the S.W. Middle part Strong winds and Rugged latter part the same spoke Ship & Stuart Capt Gardner of St John & 6 months out the Nuncas & 5 raised whaling Long by Account 158° 10' E Lat 33° 34' South

6 134 Saturday 31st
First part of these 24 hours Strong wind and rugged & 2 raised whals in company with the above mentioned Ship and struck to the Labour Boat and parted Struck to the White Boat and ran to Windward and had to cut a night took in sail to the S.W. Middle and latter part Strong wind and rugged under Double Reefed Top sail Lat 33° 15'

7 135 Sunday April 1st 1793
First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the S.W. & 4 took in sail with the Nuncas Middle and latter part Strong Gale and a heavy sea steering to the South under Double Reef Long by Acc 158° 4' Lat 33° 00'

8 136 Monday April 2nd 1793
First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the S.W. & 4 took in sail with the Nuncas Middle part the same latter part more moderate steering to the S.W. saw the Ship Stuart, cutting saw benches Long 158° 12' East Lat 33° 42' South

9 137 Tuesday April 3rd
First part of these 24 hours more moderate spoke S. S. and Nuncas & night took in sail to the S.W. Middle part the same latter steering to the S.W. under double Reef Long by Acc 158° 39' Lat 34° 03' South

10 138 Wednesday April 4th
First part of these 24 hours blowing Strong from the S.W. & 2 took in sail to the S.W. with a heavy sea and fresh squalls Middle part the same latter fresh Gales steering to the S.W. watch employed in making a fore Spencer
O. Long this day Lat 34° 10' South

On the Coast of New Holland
Thursday April 5th 1793

First part of these 24 hours more Ship to S.W. & 4 under Double reef Top sails winds S.W. & 4 big Harlequin ran across our stern bound to Sidney & night took in sail to the S.W. Middle and latter part more moderate steering S.W. O. O. O.

11 139 Friday April 6th
First part of these 24 hours fine with a heavy swell steering S.W. & 4 Sunell took in sail to the S.W. Middle part the same latter steering S.W. with the Nuncas Long by Acc 158° 38' E Lat 33° 30'

12 140 Saturday April 7th
First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the East course S.W. & 4 under took in sail and set our new fore Spencer Middle part the same latter part sail course S.W. by W Long by Acc 158° 19' E Lat 32° 49'

13 141 Sunday April 8th
First part of these 24 hours fine weather winds S.W. & 4 course S.W. by W & night Doubled Reef on our board Middle part Strong winds latter the same set the Main sail steering full by Long by Acc 158° 46' Lat 31° 45' South

14 142 Monday April 9th
First part of these 24 hours Strong winds from the East and a heavy swell steering to the North under Double reefed Top sails Middle and latter part the same saw whals one rising to windward Long by Acc 157° 15' Lat 29° 44' South

15 143 Tuesday April 10th
First part of these 24 hours Strong Gale under Double Reef steering to the S.W. & 4 winds S.W. & 4 under took in sail to the S.W. Middle part the same latter under Double Reef steering to the S.W. Long 157° 27' Lat 28° 41'

16 144 Wednesday April 11th
First part of these 24 hours squally took in fore & main Top sails and fore sail & 4 took in main Top sail blowing heavy from S.W. with rain Middle and latter part blowing hard with hard rain and hard squalls and other remarkable hard things Long by Acc 157° 57' Lat 28° 11' South
